"So the last will be first and the first last". - Matthew 20:16

You've heard the saying "it's not where you start, but how you finish." This certainly applies to this Bible passage. We have a responsibility not only for our own lives, but for the lives of others as well. We are called to generously share our gifts with others, not hoard them for our own use. GOSPEL

Matthew 20.1-16

Are you envious because I am generous?

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples.

- 1"The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard.
- When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the marketplace; 4 and he said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went.
- 5 "When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same.
- ⁶ And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them,
- 'Why are you standing here idle all day?'
- ⁷They said to him,
- 'Because no one has hired us.'

He said to them,

'You also go into the vineyard.'
