Pentecost Sunday celebrates and commemorates the gifts given to the Church in the Holy Spirit. Saints, theologians and poets have reflected for centuries on the meaning of the third Divine Person of God, trying to glimpse, however partially, the mystery in which we have been caught up.

And to read the mystics of the Church is to realise that the Holy Spirit is a mystery we're caught up in here and now. Like a person swept up in the love of another, the Church has been swept into the mystery of Divine Love by being *given* the very Love that *is* God.

O Holy One, we gather to discover Fire-Kindled by an ember that flew from the great radiance, Love's bright beginning in time and space-Flaming forth now in us. REFLECTION: Pentecost Sunday

"To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." 1 CORINTHIANS 12:7

FIRST READING

Acts 2.1-11 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind,

and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them,

and a tongue rested on each of them.
