GOSPEL

Luke 1.39-56

The Mighty One has done great things for me; God has lifted up the lowly.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

39 Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country,

- 40 where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.
- 41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb.
- And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit

42 and exclaimed with a loud cry,

"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

43 And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?

44 For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy.

45 And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment

of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

46 And Mary said,

"My soul magnifies the Lord, 47 and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

48 for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant.

49 for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

- 56 And Mary remained with Elizabeth about three months and then returned to her home.

The gospel of the Lord.

Reflection.

There are times when the monotony of daily living and the grind of dull routine sap all our energy. It results usually in a weakening of our conviction that the Lord is present and at work in our lives. We may even go so far as to doubt the possibility of a hereafter. At such moments we are crying out for the kind of reassurance and comfort that this feast day brings, for in contrast to such despair, Mary's Assumption helps lift our minds and hearts above the gloom situation we are in. It reminds us of our final homecoming by assuring us that there is another dimension to our existence and death has not the final say.

We get a glimpse of Mary as a young woman full of joy, hope and happiness, setting out in haste over the hill country to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Both women had great news to share. Their conversation was an outpouring of joy. Mary experienced happy times but she was not spared any of the trials of a mother rearing her child. There were many things in life she did not understand, much that she found painful to accept and still through all not knowing what lay before her, Mary never took back the Yes she had answered to the angel. Jesus was always the centre of her existence.

Mary, having completed her earthly pilgrimage, was assumed, body and soul into heavenly glory. It was the final crowning grace of her relationship with God. Mary's Assumption reinforces hope in our own future because she points forward to our final homecoming. Where she has gone we hope to follow. This feast is a reminder that the joys of eternal life are what God wishes to share with us all. Our chief concern in the meantime is to become more like Jesus by allowing our lives to be influenced by Mary, who has so much to teach us about her son.
