Ronita is 22. She lives with her husband and two children in a barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in Metro Manila in the Philippines.

Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life -long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family but, thankfully, she heard about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program run by the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partners in the Philippines.

Through the FCJ, Ronita was able to re-enrol in her studies and continue learning in a safe and flexible environment – even with the arrival of her second child.

After completing her ALS classes, Ronita went on to earn her Grade 12 Senior High School Diploma. With her new diploma, Ronita has now secured a job at a call centre and is looking to a brighter future for her whole family.

"I have now graduated senior school and I am so proud of myself," she said. "I feel hopeful for the future... Now it's not impossible for me to achieve my dream... Thank you."

### WEEKLY REFLECTION SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT Genesis 22:1–2, 9–13, 15–18 | Romans 8:31–34 | Mark 9:2–10

When Jesus took his closest friends to the top of a high mountain, they experienced something quite extraordinary. The transfiguration gave them a glimpse of what it meant for Jesus to be the son of God. It is hardly surprising that Peter said, 'it is wonderful for us to be here.' The Gospel also tells us that Jesus' friends were frightened, and this is also easy to understand. They were overwhelmed. Nevertheless, it's not long before Jesus reminds them that he is destined to die. His friends must come down from the mountain and walk with Jesus through all the ordinary and arduous days and weeks that lie ahead.

We can all say 'it is wonderful for us to be here' no matter where that happens to be. Life is full of wonder. That doesn't mean it is always easy. We live in the arms of a very deep mystery. God's love enfolds us.

Throughout Lent, we are called to support Project Compassion, an initiative of Caritas Australia. This year, Project Compassion celebrates 60 years of partnership with some of the most marginal communities in the world. With your help, we have walked alongside literally millions of people in dozens of countries.

This week we encounter the story of Ronita who lives in Quezon City, part of metro Manila in the Philippines. Becoming a mother at a young age meant that her schooling was cut short. Her husband, Lean, leaves for work at 3am and returns at 9pm, earning less than \$US10 per day in a demanding job in waste disposal. On such a small income, Ronita and Lean, along with two young children, are able to rent a room of about 10 square metres.



## WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2024 PALESTINE

#### 10am Friday March 1st March, Ringwood Uniting Church.

The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian laywomen's initiative. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March. The movement aims to bring together women of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year.

The theme in 2024 is

"I Beg You... Bear With One Another in Love" Ephesians 4:1-3

This program calls us to bear with each other in love, despite all difficulties and oppression. The program was written by a group of ecumenical Christian Palestinian women in response to the passage from Ephesians 4:1-7. We reflected collectively on this theme from the context of our suffering as Palestinian Christian women. We hope to inspire other women around the world to bear with one another in love during troubled times. ALL ARE WELCOME TO ATTEND

<u>Lent</u> is the 40 days of preparation for the Easter season when Christians are called to deepen their spiritual lives through the practices of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving.

We believe that regular participation in these practices — like exercise we do for our physical health — improves our spiritual well-being, by stripping away all that is unnecessary and becoming more mindful of how God is working in our lives.

Challenge yourself this year, and go beyond the usual practice of "giving up" something. Now is a great time to take stock of your spiritual life and to grow in it.

Not sure where to start? Here are some suggestions:

- Participate in a Lenten reflection Program, either through our parish groups or on line;
- Try a daily act of kindness
- Try a new 'Spiritual practice" i.e. Stations of the Cross, Rosary, Daily Mass, Meditation
- Spend some time each day in quiet reflection on your life and how you are deepening your relationship with God. Ask God about this and listen for the whisper of the Spirit in response.
- Do you spend too much on clothes or dinners? Pick an expense that you'll "fast" from during Lent, and then give the money you would usually spend to a charity
- Pray for somebody. As you're walking, travelling, or waiting somewhere, pick out a person who
  appears to be in need and pray for that person. In the words of philosopher Philo of Alexandria:
  "Be kind, for everyone you meet is fighting a great battle."
- Volunteer to participate in the Easter Liturgies it is always great to have new ideas and you will get to share your faith in a very practical way. We plan to reintroduce the large Cross to the Good Friday Service. In order to do this, we will need many new volunteers. As this is a highlight of our parish Liturgical celebrations, please volunteer your time to make it possible. We will have more information in the coming weeks.

#### **REFLECTION: 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent**

"Here I am!' he answered."- Genesis 22:11

It is easy to say, "Here I am, Lord," when we are kneeling in church. But how easy is it to say "Here I am, Lord," when a neighbor needs our help, or when we are invited to join a parish ministry, or when we are asked to provide financial support? Often times we are called when it's not convenient for us. Discipleship is not easy, most of the time it will make us uncomfortable and vulnerable..
