WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2023 TAIWAN

10am Friday March 3rd Holy Spirit Chapel Followed by Morning Tea in the Mary Bresnan Room The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian laywomen's initiative. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March. The movement aims to bring together women of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year. The theme in 2023 is God's promise in the letter to the Ephesians, which is an invitation to active listening, which is the ground of our prayers. Following the example of the letter (Ephesians 1:15-19), where the author praises the church for their faith in Jesus and love toward all the saints, the worship service contextualizes the witness of the saints with the stories from Taiwan.

All parishioners are invited to a Mass of Anointing followed by light lunch on Friday 31st March at 11am in the Church.

REFLECTION: 1st Sunday of Lent

"It is written: 'The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve.'" Matthew 4:10

Tempted between the riches and power of this world and service to God, Jesus chose service to His Father. If we wish to truly follow Jesus, we, too, must decide to turn away from worldly power and riches and put God at the center of our lives. Lent is our time to prune ourselves of earthly things, and develop and nurture heavenly things. Lent is time to repent and let go of the other "gods" we have put before God.

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Genesis.

7 The Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground,

and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.

8 And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed.

9 Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food,

the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

16 And the Lord God commanded the man,

"You may freely eat of every tree of the garden;

17 but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat,

for in the day that you eat of it you shall die."

18 Then the Lord God said,

"It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his patner.'

25 And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed.

1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal

that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman,

"Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?"

2 The woman said to the serpent,

"We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden;

3 but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree

that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die."

4 But the serpent said to the woman,

"You will not die;

5 for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened,

and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes,

and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate;

and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate.

7 Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked;

and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

12 Just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, so death spread to all, because all have sinned.
17 If, because of the trespass of one, death exercised dominion through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness exercise dominion in life through the one, Jesus Christ.
18 Therefore just as the trespass of one led to condemnation for all, so the act of righteousness of one leads to justification and life for all.
19 For just as by the disobedience of one the many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one the many will be made righteous.
