Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come. MARK 13:33

Advent is a four week season of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas and it always has a theme of looking towards the future coming of Christ at the end times. One of the prayers of the early Church which is linked with the season of waiting and longing, was the Aramaic word 'MARANATHA', which means 'Come Lord'. Use this prayer often this week as one way to begin preparation for Christmas.



Another way to bring Christ's coming into the family home is the custom of the Advent Wreath. The Advent Wreath is constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which are inserted four candles. According to tradition, three of the candles are violet, and the fourth is rose. However, four violet or white candles may also be used. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it is blessed by a parent.

The word 'Maranatha' could be used as part of the blessing.

The lighting of the candles may fittingly be included as a part of the evening meal.

(Light the first candle on the Advent wreath.)

We watch and wait. To this waiting time we bring the experiences of the year past.

This circle of green reminds us of the love of God endless, but ever new.

As we focus on the candle, what memories of the year rise up for us?

1st Sunday of Advent - Mark 13:33-37

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert, for you do not know when the time will come.

"It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with a particular task, and commands the doorkeeper to be on watch. Therefore, keep awake -in the evening or at midnight, or at cockcrow or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly.

"And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake"

Something to think about this Advent, a new way of understanding incarnation

An extended concept or interpretation for the 4 weeks of Advent – seeing the 4 weeks as "deep incarnation" which includes, of course, the incarnation of God in the person of Jesus the Christ, but also takes the understanding of incarnation much further, both back and forwards in time. This concept is something the Sisters of Mercy of Australia and Papua New Guinea have written about in their website. You may like to think about it and see how expansive this understanding of the incarnation of God is.

The description of each of the 4 weeks, in this interpretation, are as follows:

Week 1: God's incarnation in the creation of the cosmos, the birth of the universe

Week 2: God's incarnation in the creation of the Solar System we live in

Week 3: God's incarnation in the person of Jesus the Christ – In Jesus, God's presence became more obvious and believable in the world. "By his incarnation (the Christ) inserted himself not just into our humanity, but into the universe which supports humanity. The presence of the incarnate word ...shines at the heart of all things". (Teilhard de Chardin)

Week 4: God's incarnation in each being: human and other than human.

"Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." - Mark 13:33
