Dear Holy Spirit Parish,

With the lifting of some restrictions Fr Arsenio will be able to celebrate Eucharist with a small gathering of **FIVE people** under very strict guidelines, these have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

You must wear a face mask at all times.

Sanitize your hands on arrival.

All church buildings and offices remain Closed to the public during this Covid -19 time, this situations is constantly being monitored as soon as we can gather again in theses space we will.

Mass will be celebrated outdoors in the open space between the parish office and Chapel. If it is raining mass will need to be cancelled for that day you will be called on the day if that is needed.

The chairs are not to be moved from the pre marked space.

Fr Arsenio will give instructions on receiving Holy Communion during the Fraction Rite.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

It is a priority for us to be as fair to all when booking in for mass, you will need to phone and speak with Jacinta as we have questions and details to obtain from you.

You must live within the 5km radius from Holy Spirit parish.

All guidelines will be discussed with you when you book in, the mass times we have at Holy Spirit are: Wednesday 14th Oct at 9:30am to book please call on Tuesday 6th between 9am – 11am Only. Friday 16th Oct at 9:30am to book please call on Thursday 8th between 9am – 11am Only. Sunday 18th Oct at 9am to book please call on Saturday 10th between 9am – 11am Only.

And below are instructions on what is required.

Blankets must be 8ply acrylic wool....any colour! The squares must be 20cm x 20cm...usually people use size 4mm needles!

If people are crocheting blankets the same applies to them.

However, if people want to crochet or knit a whole blanket...not squares....then go for it!!!

BEANIES....beanies can be knitted or crocheted...they can use any pattern and any ply wool. There are many patterns on the internet!!

Any help would be most appreciated—they are hoping to send out the packages in time for Christmas!

BECOMING A CATHOLIC – RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Have you been feeling a nudge in your heart to deepen your relationship with God? Are you searching for meaning in your life? Do you feel restless, without direction? Are you looking to join a Faith Community? Do you want to know more about the Catholic Faith? Are you a Catholic who has not been confirmed or received first communion?

If you answered "YES" to any of these questions,

RCIA may be the answer you are seeking.

THE RCIA PROCESS

RCIA is the normal way in which adults become full, active, participating members of the Catholic Church.

The goal of the process is "full communion" which means "full active participation" in the Eucharist and in the whole life of the Catholic faith community.

RCIA helps adults to grow in their relationship with God, become familiar with Catholic teachings, get acquainted with people in the community and involved in service within the community.

ALREADY BAPTISED?

Many persons who want to join the Catholic Church have already been baptised in another Christian Church. They attend the sessions but do not need to be baptised again.

FIRST STEP - A PERIOD OF ENQUIRY

The RCIA process is a period of reflection, prayer, instruction, discernment and formation. Those who join the process are encouraged to proceed at their own pace, but, on average, the journey takes about 8 - 9 months of weekly sessions.

If the candidate wishes, this leads to the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism (if required), Confirmation and Eucharist at Easter with an ongoing attendance at Sunday Mass and observance of Catholic teachings and practices.

WHO ELSE IS INVOLVED?

Besides the RCIA Team, the entire community who participate in the Sunday Eucharist has a role to play through prayer and welcome.

RCIA IS FOR: Adults who are not baptised, Adults baptised in another Christian church and non-practising Catholics wishing to renew faith.

SESSION TIMES: 7:30pm - 9:00pm on a mutually agreed day of the week

Matthew 22.1-14

Invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

¹Once more Jesus spoke to the chief priests and Pharisees in parables:

- 2 "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son.
- 3 He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet,

but they would not come.

4 Again he sent other slaves, saying,

'Tell those who have been invited:

"Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered,

and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.""

5 But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business,

6 while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them.

7 The king was enraged.

He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city.

8 "Then he said to his slaves,

'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy.

The gospel of the Lord.

Reflection.

How could the poor man in the gospel story expected to have the necessary clothes at such short notice when he was hauled off the street into a wedding reception? And he found himself in serious trouble as he is not suitably dressed for the occasion. The parable is not about wearing the right outfit at a wedding. The message goes much deeper because the banquet referred to is eternal life in the kingdom of heaven. Jesus is saying that while God the Father has opened wide the doors of heaven and invited everybody into his kingdom, entrance is by no means automatic and should not be taken for granted. We have got to work our passage to be spiritually prepared, and prove ourselves worthy of the invitation. The wedding garment is a symbol of a life in the footsteps of Christ. It is our christening robe, pronounced that we were clothed in Christ. How are we living that life? This gospel should cause us to pause and think about the wonderful future that is within our reach. It is telling us that God is longing for our homecoming. One thing necessary is to make sure that we will arrive safely by responding to his love. When in our daily lives we avail of the opportunities of sharing in Christ's life, by beginning our day with a prayer or asking his blessing, offering encouragement and support to our neighbours. We are extending this brief spell of Eucharistic celebration into every detail of our day.



In this way we are not facing life alone. We are walking with one another and with Christ.
