WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2023 TAIWAN


Followed by Morning Tea in the Mary Bresnan Room
The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian laywomen's initiative. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March. The movement aims to bring together women of various races, cultures and traditions in a yearly common Day of Prayer, as well as in closer fellowship, understanding and action throughout the year.

The theme in 2023 is God's promise in the letter to the Ephesians, which is an invitation to active listening, which is the ground of our prayers.

Following the example of the letter (Ephesians 1:15-19), where the author praises the church for their faith in Jesus and love toward all the saints, the worship service contextualizes the witness of the saints with the stories from Taiwan.

All parishioners are invited to a Mass of Anointing followed by light lunch on Friday 31st March at 11am in the Church.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of <u>Lent</u>, the 40 days of preparation for the Easter season when Christians are called to deepen their spiritual lives through the practices of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving.

We believe that regular participation in these practices — like exercise we do for our physical health — improves our spiritual well-being, by stripping away all that is unnecessary and becoming more mindful of how God is working in our lives.

Challenge yourself this year, and go beyond the usual practice of "giving up" something. Now is a great time to take stock of your spiritual life and to grow in it.

Not sure where to start? Here are some suggestions:

- Participate in a Lenten reflection Program, either through our parish groups or on line;
- Try a daily act of kindness
- Try a new 'Spiritual practice" i.e. Stations of the Cross, Rosary, Daily Mass, Meditation
- Spend some time each day in quiet reflection on your life and how you are deepening your relationship with God. Ask God about this and listen for the whisper of the Spirit in response.
- Do you spend too much on clothes or dinners? Pick an expense that you'll "fast" from during Lent, and then give the money you would usually spend to a charity
- Pray for somebody. As you're walking, travelling, or waiting somewhere, pick out a person who appears to be in need and pray for that person. In the words of philosopher Philo of Alexandria: "Be kind, for everyone you meet is fighting a great battle."
- Volunteer to participate in the Easter Liturgies it is always great to have new ideas and you will get to share your faith in a very practical way


HOLY SPIRIT LENTEN DISCUSSION GROUPS

FOR THE INFORMATION OF PARISHIONERS LENT 2023

- 109. The Lenten season has a twofold character:
 - 1) it recalls baptism or prepares for it;
 - 2) it stresses a penitential spirit.

By these means especially, Lent readies the faithful for celebrating the paschal mystery after a period of closer attention to the Word of God, and more ardent prayer. In the liturgy itself and in the liturgy-centred instructions, these baptismal and penitential themes should be more pronounced. Hence:

- a) Wider use is to be made of baptismal features proper to the Lenten liturgy...
- b) The same approach holds for the penitential elements...
- 110. During Lent, penance should not be only internal and individual but also external and social...
 In any event, let the paschal fast be kept sacred. It should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection may be visited on uplifted and responsive spirits.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

- (a) **Prayer** -for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.
- (b) **Self-Denial** for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.
- (c) **Helping Others** for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened; or in other ways.
- All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain (Canon 1252).
- The Season of Lent is a time of penance. During this season the faithful are exhorted to devote themselves in a special manner to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves.
- Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 22 February 2023 and Trinity Sunday, 4 June 2023 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.
- The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
 Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament.
 All the faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

HOLY WEEK - The 2023 Ordo contains instructions for the Rites of Holy Week.

<u>FUNERALS</u> — On Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday all Masses for the Dead, including Funeral Masses, **are forbidden**. Funerals on these days are celebrated with the Liturgy of the Word and without the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

<u>WEDDINGS</u> - Weddings should be discouraged during the Easter Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday. Should a couple be particularly insistent on a wedding for one of these days, then please indicate that no decorations (including flowers), no music nor Nuptial Mass will be permitted.
