


Holy Spirit is a child safe parish. At Holy Spirit we hold the care, safety and well being of children and young people as a central and fundamental responsibility of our parish.



'The Blessing' Project

Hi everyone! To help keep our Parish community going during the COVID lockdown, we are starting another **choir-inspired** music video project. This time, we would like to involve as many people from the Parish as possible, especially families and children.

You may have seen a song called 'The Blessing' that has been sung throughout the world in a multitude of languages by Christians during COVID-19 to remind the world that God is with us and to give everyone a sense of belonging and unity. You can find some great versions on YouTube – just search for The Blessing. We would like to do a Holy Spirit Parish version of The Blessing. All you have to do is record a video of you or your family singing, playing, dancing or just waving along in time with the music. You can submit more than one video, and if you are a musician, we'd love to have you playing as well. A video with as many familiar faces as possible would be most uplifting to our community so please don't feel that you need to have musical talent to be involved. If you have a real aversion to singing feel free to just clap along to the song, tap a triangle, saucepan lid, sway, dance, hold up a sign of love, peace etc. This is about sharing something as a community. If you would like to be a part of this project please follow the instructions below.

How to record your video

You'll need a mobile phone with a camera, and someone to operate it (or use a stand if you have one). You can use the selfie camera if you like, but the rear camera will generally produce best results. If you aren't able to record a video, a photo of your family doing something would be fine.

You will need to sing/play/dance in time with the backing track. You can find the backing track on YouTube at this link https://youtu.be/yWHQ9YRmXBg.

If you are singing or playing an instrument, it would be good if you can listen to the backing track on earphones so it doesn't come out in your recording. For musicians, there is an attached lead sheet if you need it. The lyrics are also attached.

Once you have recorded your video, please contact Bill or Maree Buttler to arrange for it to be picked up. We can use a USB drive to transfer it, or you can upload it to YouTube and send us the link, or email your photo to us at billnmaree@optusnet.com.au (videos will probably be too big to email).

Once we have enough contributions, we'll put them together into a video collage that can be displayed on the Parish website and Facebook page. Get recording, and have fun!


There have been some useful changes which are best explained by reading these notes in conjunction with the image of our home page (next page).

- The web site can now be searched. This is perhaps the best of the improvements. If you're looking for something and can't remember where it's placed start here.
- If you are on a small form factor device (smart phone or table) you will see the "hamburger" in the top left corner. Click this to see the menu

The Menu

- a. The menu now sports "Covid 19". This is the full list of announcements we have made since the restrictions took place – mostly these come from Jacinta's weekly update. We also have the most recent two on the home page ("Covid 19 Updates" refer 6). Previously we had the most recent one on the home page and the rest on another page that was a bit less obvious to find and much harder to maintain. This change is mostly of benefit to me;)
- b. "News, Events" has been revamped. It used to be a menu list of articles which were difficult to navigate and appreciate what they might contain. Now it is a series of summaries each with an associated image and details should you wish to "clickin". This means a more manageable interface and better user experience.
- c. Contact Us can is now fits on our menu. Previously it was only available by the phone icon in the top right corner which is not the first place many people would look.
- The rotating banners are as they were a number of standard (e.g. current Mass season which clicks through to mass times) and newly

- featured items (e.g. click through the Choir image to see and hear our Choir in action) each of which allows the user to click-through to the content.
- "Holy Spirit Parish Online How we stay connected" is as it was – a place to click through to see a list of online resources such as weekly streamed masses and Zoom meeting updates, etc.
- Covid 19 Updates. As explained in 3a, this is the most recent two announcements and you can "click here for more updates on Covid 19".
- Welcome to Holy Spirit Parish. This too is unchanged and our Welcome message to the world.
- Reflections. This is as it was, a reflection from our Parish Priest. However, a significant recent change is that a new reflection is added reliably each week. It doesn't matter how sophisticated the web site is if it has no interesting content. Now we have something valuable to share regularly. Thanks Father Arsenio! (Click "More Reflections..." to previous ones).
- Tweets by @Pontifex is Pope Francis' Twitter Feed. This is as it was. It automatically updates daily. I have no interest in Twitter myself, but I feel that this feed is worthy of our time.
- At Today's Readings you can find today's Bible readings courtesy of Melbourne Catholic (Catholic Archdiocese Melbourne).
- 11. The 8 Icons at the bottom of every page are technically the same. They are a quick way to navigate to main sections of the site. With the change I have taken the opportunity to give "Spirit Extra!" its own button (Helen can lay claim to this new small piece of "screen real estate" next to her "Spirit Magazine").
- 12. The Footer is unchanged. It too shows at the bottom of every page and tells people who and where we are and also has links to the legal type documents that is required of us.

Hello Winter Shelter Volunteers

We are fortunate to have over 300 volunteers registered to help in our Winter Shelter program, but as you know, this year has been very different and we have not been able to place everyone into volunteering roles. Because of Covid18 we have encouraged our senior aged volunteers to come out of home to participate in our rostered "on ground" pro grams. Instead, many of you are cooking or baking at home and this is an enormous help, thank you. Our current pro grams require volunteers from the late afternoons and this also limits some volunteers availability because many are

working. Over May and June we distributed more than 1200 meals made by our volunteers and including some donated by RACV and Fairshare. We have been busy!

However, we do still need your help. If you are not already volunteering or would like to do more, here are some ways to help:

- · we really need warm socks and underwear for men (new)
- · we need toiletries such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, soap
- we would love your home baked slices, biscuits for our Wednesday, Sunday or Mondays (please package individually or in small quantities)
- donations of fresh fruit, and individual small bottles of water for Wednesday, Sunday or Mondays (please deliver them to any of the venues we are distributing meals from - or check with us)
- Volunteers for the Shower program in East Ringwood on Tuesdays 1.00pm-3pm and Thursdays 10am-12pm. It is an easy role and really just means being there with another volunteer to supervise the use of the facility.
- Cooking 8 serves of meals for Wednesday nights (we can pick up)
 If you can assist with any of these requests please let us know.

Please let us or your volunteer driver know ASAP, if you need more containers to put your cooked meals into.

GOSPEL


Matthew 14.13-21 All ate and were filled.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

- 13 When Jesus heard that Herod had beheaded John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself.
 But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns.
- 14 When he went ashore, Jesus saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick.
- 15 When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves."
- 16 Jesus said to them,"They need not go away;you give them something to eat."
- 17 They replied,
- "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish."
- 18 And he said, "Bring them here to me."
- 19 Then Jesus ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass.

Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds.

- 20 And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full.
- 21 And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Reflection.

Jesus did not feed the stranded crowd at the edge of the sea of Galilee all on his own. He accomplished it with the help of his disciples who were reluctant to accept responsibility for the hungry people. Challenged by Jesus to use their own resources, they remembered having five loaves and two fishes which they brought to him. The little they had when placed in the hands of Jesus turned out to be more than enough for all. In our own eyes it may seem of little account but it is what the Lord has given us and expects us to use in his service. It may be our ability to be a good neighbour, a caring listener, or a willing member of our community. In whatever way, we minister to the needs of others, show the compassion of Christ and extend his friendship. We are reminded that when we gather around the altar, we make an offering of self and accept the challenge of Jesus to do what we can for the food of others. He receives our gifts in the same manner as he accepted the five loaves and two fishes from the disciples, and gives them value. The Lord sends us forth to give as we have received, to forgive as we have been forgiven, and to love as we have been loved. Stay well and safe!- Fr. Arsenio.
