REFLECTION: 2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

"Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'" John 20:19

Are you good at making people feel welcome? When you meet someone new, like a new neighbor, a new work colleague or a new parishioner, do you make them feel at home? When we make people feel welcome, we make them feel like they are included instead of being excluded. We are made for relationships – with God and each other. When you see yourself as a beloved son or daughter of God, you tend to see others the same way, too – just as God, Our Father, sees us.

FIRST READING Acts 2.42-47

All who believed were together and had all things in common.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Those who welcomed the message of Peter were baptized and many were added to the community.

42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

43 Awe came upon everyone,

because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles.

- 44 All who believed were together and had all things in common;
- 45 they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need.
- 46 Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts,
- 47 praising God and having the goodwill of all the people.

And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

SECOND READING

1 Peter 1.3-9

God has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

A reading from the first letter of Peter.

- 3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead:
- 4 a birth into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you,
- 5 who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.
- 6 In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials,
- 7 so that the genuineness of your faith —being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire— may be found to result in praise and glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed.
- 8 Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy,
- 9 for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

GOSPEL ACCLAMAT I O N

You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; happy those who have not seen me, but still believe!

GOSPEL John 20.19-31

A week later Jesus came and stood among them.

A reading from the holy gospel according to John.

19 It was evening on the day Jesus rose from the dead,

the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the authorities.

Jesus came and stood among them and said,

"Peace be with you."

20 After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side.

Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

21 Jesus said to them again,

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

22 When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them,

"Receive the Holy Spirit.

23 If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them;

if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

24 But Thomas, who was called the Twin, one of the twelve,

was not with them when Jesus came.

25 So the other disciples told him,

"We have seen the Lord."

But he said to them,

"Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

26 A week later his disciples were again in the house,

and Thomas was with them.

Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said,

"Peace be with you."

27 Then he said to Thomas,

"Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side.

Do not doubt but believe."

28 Thomas answered him,

"My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him,

"Have you believed because you have seen me?

Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

30 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples,

which are not written in this book.

31 But these are written so that you may come to believe

that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God,

and that through believing you may have life in his name.
