ROSARY GROUP/PRAYER FOR PRIESTS

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 7.30 pm to 8.30 pm with rosary prayed from 7.30 pm till 8.00 pm. We are now in our 22nd year and have a core group of 14 or so but seldom have more than 10 people on any given night. During Lent we include The Stations of the Cross. This usually attracts a few extra people.

First Saturday Devotion

This has been going since 1995 in our parish. Again a core group of 12/13 people with 10 most times. Our Lady asked for 5 First Saturdays when she appeared to the 3 children at Fatima, Portugal in 1917. The format is much the same as for Wednesday night, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament immediately after 9.30am mass, plus the rosary and Fatima prayers.

The Cenacle of Prayer for Priests

This Cenacle of Prayer for Priests takes place on all other Saturday mornings after the 9.30am mass and is led by Lyn Thwaites. The rosary and a few other prayers are prayed including making an Act of Consecration to The Immaculate Heart of Mary. We pray for The Holy Father, all cardinals bishops and priests including Fr. Joseph and all the priests of the Deanery. We conclude with a reading of one of the locutions given by Our Lady to Fr. Stefano Gobbi. These were given for a period of almost 25 years from July, 1973 to 31 December, 1997.

There is not much to report. The various group numbers have neither grown nor declined. But when someone can no longer attend for whatever reason Our Lady always sends someone else to take their place.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

Children's Liturgy has continued to provide an opportunity for pre-school and primary aged children to participate in a version of the gospel that targets their understanding. This includes meditation, introductory prayer, gospel reading & discussion, their own prayers of the faithful and ends with an activity. The children and their leaders return to mass at the time of the Offertory procession.

Over the last year Children's Liturgy was successfully introduced for 6pm mass on Saturday nights and continued as part of 10.30am mass on Sundays. Twenty dedicated volunteers are our current leaders and at least 2 are rostered on at each mass during school terms. Nine new leaders have joined over the last year to meet the demand across 2 masses each weekend.

Children attend from our parish school and also many other local schools in our area. The number participating varies greatly from 6-45 with an average of approximately 15. The class level masses during 2012 have attracted more children and new colourful activity sheets have been introduced from Term 2, 2013.

FAITH DISCUSSION GROUP

We would like to celebrate the gift this group have been to each other and the parish at a Sunday liturgy later this year.

HIGH SPIRITS/RCIC

In the hope of engaging families more directly with the weekend faith community, last year saw the move from an after-school session for children only, to an RCIC model, parents and children together and following the same process and stages as the RCIA.

15 families participated (25 children) in this journey of initiation which culminated in reception into the Church on Easter Sunday at the 10.30am Mass. Together we celebrated 10 Baptisms, 20 Confirmations and 20 1st Eucharist! Feedback from participants via a recent survey of parents and children was very positive.

Children's Liturgy at the Saturday night 6pm mass/ Sunday 10.30 mass was an integral part of the RCIC.

Past High Spirits families were directed to attend children's liturgy on a regular basis and slot into the Parish Sacramental Program where appropriate. Many of these families have disconnected from regular parish life.

Children's mass and bible story books available at the door of the Church for children to use at any weekend mass were/are well received.

BAPTISM PREPARATION GROUP

The Holy Spirit Baptism Group has the privileged role in our Parish Community of welcoming families to our Parish at one of the most special times in a family's faith journey. Each month a member of our Baptism Team presents an information meeting to families that have contacted the Parish wishing to have their baby baptised at Holy Spirit. Each family is asked to book into and attend an information session as well as a Welcoming Ceremony prior to the date of their child's Baptism. Presentation of a video and informal discussion and relevant information and documentation is given to parents during our information session. Confirmation of their child's Baptism date is also attended to during the 1-1/12 hr session. Sessions are held in the Parish House at 7:30pm on the second Tuesday evening of the month, with the exception of October when the date is changed if it coincides with fete week. During the past 12 months we have welcomed and Baptised approx. 70-80 babies or young children into our Parish Community. Fees for Baptism have been increased this year to \$80 for families who are Parishioners and \$100 for non Parishioners. Father Joe and Father Frank attend to Baptisms which are conducted in the church for families expecting larger number of guests or when more than one family have requested the same date to have their child Baptised. The Chapel is also used for Baptisms upon request and for smaller ceremonies. Baptism Ceremonies are available to families every weekend of the year with exception to weekends when there are other significant Parish functions taking place. January is the only month where we do not take bookings for Baptisms, as Father Joe is on leave at this time. Our Parish is blessed with a small group of volunteers who offer their time, warmth and care to conduct our monthly Baptism meetings. Much appreciation and many thanks must go to our wonderful committee. Members for 2013 are as follows: Yvette Collins, Lisa Keedle, Ruth Smith, Janet Feher, Leanne Thompson (Baptism Group Coordinator). During this coming year there are a few small changes that could be made to improve our current meetings. Having some photos and perhaps some video footage of Baptism and Welcoming Ceremonies that take place at Holy Spirit may give a more personal touch. We all look forward to continuing to be part of this special ministry within the Holy Spirit Parish Community.

SERVICE AND OUTREACH

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

We have 22 members and meet weekly.

We provided the following material assistance for the 12 months to 30/06/2012

No. of cases 270 - 407 adults & 367 children Fruit & Vegetable weekly runs 25 (av. 10 families per run) A total of 417 households were assisted Spent \$14,810 on supermarket food vouchers \$7740 in donated food

We conduct the annual Winter Appeal where non perishable food, clothing & bedding is generously donated by parishioners & our local primary & secondary schools. Last December we delivered 77 Christmas hampers and toys Also we made up 10 baskets of food for a local rooming house for approx.. 12 residents. In conjunction with the hampers we provide cash for the families to purchase fresh food for their Christmas meals. In January we take up to 6 children of assisted families to the Kids' Summer Camp at Mt. Martha for a week. We rely totally on donations, fund raising & income from our Vinnies Shop to provide assistance. We receive no government financial at all.

Development History

- Mid 2009
 - The idea for a revamped web site came originally from "Our Parish Past & Present" forum
- Mid 2010
 - The call for a new web site came again from "Spirit Search"
 Parish forum
- 03/2011
 - Following on from the prior forums the PPC moved to establish a new Parish web site.
 - Meanwhile, the then current web site was expanded whilst Parish House determines the parish's longer term requirements
 - From 05/2011: Word and Spirit Magazine loaded regularly to the web site by Parish House staff. Helpful for parishioners who can't get to mass on the weekend
 - From 08/2011: 10 Group pages were added and later another four.
- 18/03/2013
 - Launch of the refreshed site

Issues

- Requires a technician to maintain. Should be maintainable by parish house staff at a minimum and ideally should allow page owners to maintain their pages, e.g. group leaders
- Insufficient structure and associated content does not adequately convey the richness of our parish. Can't be easily extended.
- Doesn't compare well with most other parishes.
- Web sites are in many ways where people's first impressions of an organisation are made. Our web site was not doing our Parish justice.

- Easy to use and maintain
- Lots of imagery that "shows off" our parish
- Consistent style and layout re-branding of the Parish logo
- Relates well to our school web site

PASTORAL CARE

2012 was a busy year again in Pastoral Care with many families suffering challenges in their lives, especially with the loss of 18 parishioners from our community. Preparation of Funerals, spending time with bereaved families and execution of Requiem Mass is also a major part of the workload. Holy Spirit Parish is experiencing many parishioners reaching elderly years and being moved from homes into local Nursing Homes. There were weekly visits with Eucharist and monthly masses at Gracedale Nursing Home and mass being introduced at Cherry Tree Retirement Village in Croydon last year. Approx. 30 parishioners attend this mass each month and afterwards lunch is served and Father Joe and Tina both attend this enjoyable ministry. Many sick people at home has increased the workload as the Sunday Communion Roster is currently full, so I make home visits to over 5 others each week. I also make visits to those who are alone, sick and struggling with issues in their lives. Parishioners regularly drop into the Parish House for a place to go and talk as they may be uneasy with society or themselves or with relationships. Just being a listening ear is usually all that is needed, but if we can refer people to health and counselling resources we do so. Catholic Care is a resource that we recommend on a regular basis. A few families from Holy Spirit Community School suffered marriage and family breakdown during last year and they sometimes come to the Parish for assistance and support. We always drop everything at these times and spend as much time as needed to help make these people feel valued and loved. Spiritual/religious issues are often part of a quest for a deeper meaning of life and understanding of self - time is spent with parishioners to help them journey through their times of doubt. Hospital visits also take up many hours of each week but the time invested in these visits is invaluable. This coming year I will be focussing on offering reflective programs for married couples and I hope that my time can be shared at Baptism meetings so that I can meet and get to know the new young people entering our parish. We need to meet together and work out ways we can start making changes in our parish so that we become attractive for young people to enable them to get more in touch with their spiritualism. People are really looking for God in their lives but many cannot relate to the Church these days. Let us all pray that Our Lord shows us the way to move forward in this fast changing world that we live in. Tina Toomey, Pastoral Worker.

SCHOOL

On behalf of the school community of Holy Spirit Community School it is my pleasure to present the 2012 school report. I wish to point out it would be impossible to explain all highlights/achievements in a limited space of time. This report should be read in conjunction with monthly Parish Pastoral Council reports I deliver.

Student Numbers

August census showed 466 students (305 families) were enrolled; this was slightly down from 2011 but we are still holding on to pleasing enrolments in spite of very strong competition from surrounding schools.

In 2012, as with previous years there were 18 classes:

3 x Prep

5 x 1/2

5 X 3 / 4

5 X 5/6

Staff

In 2012 Holy Spirit School employed 43 staff.

Teachers 18 full –time; 8 part-time, including Principal, Deputy Principal, Student Wellbeing, Reading Recovery, Literacy and Maths,

Office staff – 2 full-time – Bursar and secretary

Student Support staff – 10, all part –time.

Specialist teachers 4 of Italian, Library, Performing Arts and Physical Education, all part-time.

Counsellor -1, part-time.

In a number of classes we have shared teaching arrangements where two teachers take the class.

The Deputy Principal was released from the classroom. His role entailed 0.6 to complete DP duties, which are many, and varied, plus 0.2 ICT and 0.2 Sport.

Positions of Leadership – Religious Education, Student Services, Learning and Teaching, Maths, Literacy and Level Leaders. Within the above numbers we employed two graduate teachers.

Fees and Levies:

Fees: 95.2% Levies: 90.00%

Follow up with non –paid fees continued in 2013.

School Improvements:

2012 was a relatively minor year for building works, when compared to previous years, with the major item being the construction of the Meditation Garden. We are enormously proud of this centre piece of our school. Renovation of the oval was successfully completed. Obviously continual maintenance works were done to the site.

Academic Results:

Data from sources such as NAPLAN show that Holy Spirit continues to provide a quality education. Our continual aim is to improve in all areas of the curriculum. Evidence of this striving for improvement was the school's involvement in ACU/CEOM CTLM project. Staff and students found this project to be most productive. Five professional development days were given over to this project plus fortnightly after school meetings and professional development sessions. We are also worked steadily in the ICT area with staff receiving ipads; a number of classes commenced blogging and all that goes with this exciting technology. Religious Education continued to be central to all we did. Weekly 8:30

Religious Education continued to be central to all we did. Weekly 8:30 masses, whole school masses, sacramental programs, making the children aware of social justice issues, daily prayer and Christian meditation demonstrated our Catholic faith. We are proud to be a Catholic school.

Parent Committees

School Board, Parents & Friends, Maintenance, Uniform Shop, OSHC – are valued and are empowered to fulfil their roles. The School Board, P and F, OSHC meet at each month with Maintenance on a needs basis. The works these groups complete around the school are fantastic; they bring so much to our community.

School Parish Links

A great sense of community exists between our School and Parish. The existing links continue to be very strong and highly valued. The cooperation is evident with the sacramental programs, masses, visits by parish to the school, use of the Community Centre etc.

The Parish dinners (6 per year) organised by Marisa Smeed and Meagan Whitworth, continue to be an example of ways we strive to build community.

Our Vision inspires us to set an example in the wider community and make a connection to our constantly changing world. This is our challenge for the future.

- * ran 2 stalls at the Fete, cooked lunch for the teachers on World teachers day, assisted with the New prep parent dinner, Morning tea and finally our whole school end of Year BBQ that finished a very successful year for the Parents and Friends Committee who all enjoy being able to give back the school community which in turn benefits our children.


