Over three years ago the decision was announced to hold a Plenary Council and the People of God began preparing for this historic moment by listening to God and by listening to one another's stories of faith. GOSPEL

Mark 10.17-30 Go, sell what you own; then follow me.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark.

17 As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" 18 Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. 19 You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother.'" 20 He said to Jesus. "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." 21 Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." 22 When the man heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. 23 Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" 24 And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! 25 It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." 26 They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?" 27 Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible."

The gospel of the Lord.

Reflection.

In an age when many of us find it difficult to make ends meet, society pounds us with a set of values based on the need for material security. It judges our success by the size of our possessions, bank accounts and the exclusiveness of the area in which we live. But the wisdom that comes from God measures differently and puts power and riches as nothing. Spiritual values run deeper than worldly standards. There is more to life than what is immediately perceptible. Wealth mixes with worship of God just about as well as oil and water, and we cannot buy our way into heaven.

The rich young man in the gospel exhibited goodness, respectability, and observing the commandments. He asked Christ a fundamental question: What must I do to inherit eternal life? He got an unexpected answer. He is proud that he has done nothing wrong in his life but Jesus was not that impressed. Jesus was more interested in the use he had made of his life, in the good he had done, and whether he was prepared to go out of his way to help others. He looked him straight in the eyes and invited him to sell he had and to come and follow him. Here was a young man who went away saddened because he was unable to make the sacrifice. His vision was limited to his possessions.

Jesus singles him out as an admonition. All of us are invited to answer God's call: come follow me. Jesus is not asking us to admire his way of life but to live it fully and not as part time followers. Discipleship is always costly and following Jesus makes very total demands on our lifestyle. Our following Christ means making the best use of our present situation and placing our lives in his hands. We only have one life and Christ is inviting us to leave the world a better place for our presence.
