### **PLEASE NOTE:**

With the easing of some COVID19 restrictions, Fr Arsenio will now be able to celebrate Mass on a very limited basis at Holy Spirit. The Archdiocese and the Victorian Government have set very strict guidelines governing the service. There will only be **15** places available on weekdays and 20 places on weekends and we will need to register attendance for all Masses. We will also try to fair-share to provide as many people access as we can.

These pre-arranged weekday Masses(15 places) will be held on Wednesday & Friday mornings at 10am in the Chapel.

To register interest for weekday Masses, please ring only on the **Parish mobile number 0434 224 483 by 3pm Tuesday**. You will be contacted after 4pm on Tuesday to be advised if you have been successful for weekday Masses.

Weekend Masses will be celebrated in the Church (20 places) on Saturday evening at 6pm and Sunday morning at 9am. Bookings will be taken the same way as weekday Masses. You need to register by calling the Parish Mobile number 0434 224 483 by 3pm

- Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God."



# Reflection.

When we come to worship, we usually make the sign of the cross. The words with the holy action 'In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, ' remind us that there are three persons in God. The feast of the Holy Trinity is a celebration of the mystery of God as a family of love. This reminds us of a simple truth which we often forget, God's plan is that we share in his life of glory. By our baptism we are raised to a level at which we become sharers in the family life of God. We are born of God the Father, God the Son becomes our brother, and the love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. This revelation of his inner life of three persons, in which we have a share, is one of God's greatest gifts to us and it is the model towards which all of us should aim and strive.

Everyday is a day to love so we should strive to make the Holy Trinity a more practical part of our lives. Love is the binding force, so when we love we share in that community of love which is the living God. It calls on us to respond to the love of God, poured into our hearts by Christ and the Holy Spirit, and invites us to look forward to the day when we shall share in the glory of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
