Australian Red Cross Lifeblood's Ringwood blood donor centre is in need of blood donors, especially on 26th and 27th January.

Of course blood donations are needed every day, so if these dates are not suitable for individuals they are most welcome to book in for any other day that is convenient.

Bookings to donate are a must and can be made by calling 13 14 95 or via https://www.lifeblood.com.au/.

Blood donation is free to do and only takes an hour of your time, with every donor having their blood pressure, pulse and haemoglobin levels checked prior to donating – so it is a good screening for one's own health status.

The Ringwood donor centre is located at 38 Charter Street, Ringwood (between Bunnings and Costco), and is open 7 days a week to collect blood, plasma and platelet donations from the local community.

REFLECTION: 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed Him." Matthew 4:22

Just as Jesus called the first apostles, He calls each of us to follow Him, too. Not everyone is called to leave their business or family behind, but we are expected to put God first in everything. In gratitude to God, we should give our first and best of everything to Him: our time in daily prayer, our talent in participating in one of our parish ministries and our treasure to support the financial needs of our parish mission.

FIRST READING

Isaiah 9.1-4

In Galilee of the nations, the people have seen a great light.

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

The Lord spoke to me and said: 1 "There will be no gloom for those who were in anguish. In the former time the Lord brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the latter time he will make glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations. 2 "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darknesson them light has shined. 3 You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. 4 "For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian." 1 Corinthians 1.10-13, 17-18 I appeal to you that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you.

10 I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. 11 For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. 12 What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." 13 Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? 17 For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. 18 For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.
