
This weekend we have a collection for "Catholic Deaf".

The origins of the John Pierce Centre (JPC) date back to 1935 when Father John Pierce as appointed as the first Chaplain to the Catholic Deaf Community in Victoria by Archbishop Mannix.

Today the JPC operates as an independent not for profit company limited by guarantee and maintains its links with the Catholic Church as a member of Catholic Social Services Victoria. The Catholic Church supports JPC by providing the premises of our Deaf Community Centre and by funding for the cost of the Lay Chaplain, religious and pastoral care services.

JPC receives no government funding but receives generous donations, bequests and grants from philanthropic organisations to fund its work each year. The services of the JPC are available to all Deaf people and include family support programs, counseling and adult education opportunities.

REFLECTION: 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." - Matthew 25:13

Many of us have put off doing something because we think we are too busy. We've all said, "I'll do it later when I have time." Unfortunately, too many of us apply this attitude to our Faith. Jesus' call is urgent, in the here and now, in your current circumstances. How is God calling you to use your gifts today? Don't delay. None of us is guaranteed tomorrow.

FIRST READING

Wisdom 6.12-16
Wisdom is found by those who seek her.

A reading from the book of Wisdom.

- 12 Wisdom is radiant and unfading, and she is easily discerned by those who love her, and is found by those who seek her.
- 13 She hastens to make herself known to those who desire her.
- 14 One who rises early to seek her will have no difficulty, for she will be found sitting at the gate.
- 15 To fix one's thought on her is perfect understanding, and one who is vigilant on her account will soon be free from care,
- 16 because she goes about seeking those worthy of her, and she graciously appears to them in their paths, and meets them in every thought.

- 13 We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope.
- 14 For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died.
- 15 For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died.
- 16 For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first.
- 17 Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever.
- 18 Therefore encourage one another with these words.

GOSPEL

Matthew 25.1-13

Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

When talking about his coming in glory, Jesus spoke this parable to the disciples:

1 "The kingdom of heaven will be like this.

Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom.

- 2 Five of them were foolish, and five were wise.
- 3 When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them;
- 4 but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps.
- 5 As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept.
- 6 "But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom!

Come out to meet him.'

- 7 Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps.
- 8 The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.'
- 9 But the wise replied,
- 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us;

you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.'

- 10 And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came,
- and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut.
