Dear Holy Spirit Parishioners,

Regular Mass arrangements:

Under current restrictions, we can now have 75 people attend mass while still maintaining the 1 person per 4 square meter rule. **At this stage, booking are no longer required**, however, this may be reviewed again.

To comply with COVID regulations, anyone attending mass will need to use the QR code for electronic contact tracing purposes.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be a Covid Marshal and our welcomers on duty to assist. Please arrive early to ensure you are seated and registered well before Fr Arsenio is ready to commence Mass.

Weekend Masses are Saturday evening at 6pm, Sunday morning at 9am and 5pm in the Church. Please note: under current guidelines, our maximum capacity in the church is **75**. Wednesday & Friday morning Masses will be celebrated at **9:15am** in the Chapel. The capacity is **15**. This will be reviewed weekly, depending on numbers attending..

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- You must wear a face mask.
- Sanitize your hands on arrival.
- Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.

If chairs are moved, please return them to the pre marked spaces at the end of Mass.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.



I would like to thank you all for keeping me in your prayers and hearts these last, nearly 3 years, and especially these last few months. Unfortunately my breast cancer is gaining momentum and it is not looking good for me.

I am constantly moved and humbled by the continuous flow of love and care I have been shown by so many of you. Cards, flowers, gifts, baking, messages, calls, and many many prayers. So special, and so deeply appreciated.

Then last week, I was gifted the opportunity to hold a "living wake" - on Zoom! - by the kindness and ingenuity of Mary Ryan, Tina Toomey, and my great partner in crime, Kerry Haddow. This was a direct benefit of Covid (it's certainly an ill wind that blows no good!)

155 people from all around the world tuned in for over 2 hours, sharing prayer, songs, poems, amusing anecdotes and stories. It was the most incredible raft of love and support and I am still buoyed in the light when I think on it. The Holy Spirit was surely at work in and through people that night. It was quite extraordinary, and as a consequence, I thoroughly recommend a living wake to everyone!!

I have found many serendipities in knowing that my life is nearing its end. I have tried not to leave things unsaid. I have worked on personal legacy projects, and advocated for women with metastatic breast cancer. Yet I have so much more to do! And that includes thanking every one of you for your love, for your prayers, for your appreciation of my singing over the years, and for being the most amazing community in which to belong. I am so glad that was my story.

Dear Colleagues and Church communities,

As we bunker down in lockdown #5, I hope and trust that you are finding unexpected experiences of grace and love in life amidst the frustration and concern that we are all living with.

The Winter Shelter Exec team (Andy Tiver, Jeff Garrioch, Scott Hawkins, Gitta Clayton and I) met on Monday 19 July to discuss the progress and short-term future of Winter Shelter this year. You may be aware that due to a variety of factors we have had a significantly lower number of guests than in previous years.

The team discussed the various reasons for the reduced take up of beds, they include:

- Government homeless to home program placing people sleeping rough in homes (which we celebrate). <u>https://fac.dhhs.vic.gov.au/news/homelessness-home-initiative</u>
- Lockdown motel accommodation.

Considering these events and the recurring lockdowns, we explored a variety of options for the immediate future of the WS program. Areas we discussed included:

- **D** Reduced capacity shelter centred around 1 venue.
- □ Inviting women to also participate in the program.
- Utilising a day shelter as an alternative.

Sadly, we were not able to find a viable solution, so with much sadness, I am sharing with you that the Winter Shelter accommodation programme will be suspended immediately and for the remainder of the 2021 period. This is not a decision taken lightly. However due to our desire to keep guest and volunteers safe and value the time and energy of our volunteers, we do not believe the program is viable this year.

We also remain very aware of the real needs of many in our community during this time. Therefore, we will again pivot to providing an alternative service that has been heavily utilised in the past through a meals service. This will be in the form of community meals gathered (when allowed) and continuing to prepare take away meals delivered to those in need.

Gitta will be in contact with volunteers and others who would like to participate in the meals programme.

Would you please communicate this announcement to your church communities and express our disappointment with having to take this step.
