Dear Holy Spirit Parish,

With the lifting of some restrictions Fr Arsenio will be able to celebrate Eucharist with a small gathering of **FIVE people** under very strict guidelines, these have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- You must wear a face mask at all times.
- <u>Sanitize your hands on arrival</u>.

All church buildings and offices remain Closed to the public during this Covid -19 time, this situations is constantly being monitored as soon as we can gather again in theses space we will.

Mass will be celebrated outdoors in the open space between the parish office and Chapel. If it is raining mass will need to be cancelled for that day you will be called on the day if that is needed.

The chairs are not to be moved from the pre marked space.

Fr Arsenio will give instructions on receiving Holy Communion during the Fraction Rite.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

It is a priority for us to be as fair to all when booking in for mass, you will need to phone and speak with Jacinta as we have questions and details to obtain from you.

You must live within the 25km radius from Holy Spirit parish.

Friday 30th Oct at 10:15am** to book please call on Thursday 29th between 9am – 11am Only. Sunday 1st Nov at 9am to book please call on Saturday 31st between 9am – 11am Only.

And below are instructions on what is required.

Blankets must be 8ply acrylic wool....any colour! The squares must be 20cm x 20cm...usually people use size 4mm needles!

If people are crocheting blankets the same applies to them.

However, if people want to crochet or knit a whole blanket...not squares....then go for it!!! BEANIES....beanies can be knitted or crocheted...they can use any pattern and any ply wool. There are many patterns on the internet!!

Any help would be most appreciated—they are hoping to send out the packages in time for Christmas!

BECOMING A CATHOLIC – RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Have you been feeling a nudge in your heart to deepen your relationship with God? Are you searching for meaning in your life? Do you feel restless, without direction? Are you looking to join a Faith Community? Do you want to know more about the Catholic Faith? Are you a Catholic who has not been confirmed or received first communion?

If you answered "YES" to any of these questions,

RCIA may be the answer you are seeking.

THE RCIA PROCESS

RCIA is the normal way in which adults become full, active, participating members of the Catholic Church.

The goal of the process is "full communion" which means "full active participation" in the Eucharist and in the whole life of the Catholic faith community.

RCIA helps adults to grow in their relationship with God, become familiar with Catholic teachings, get acquainted with people in the community and involved in service within the community.

ALREADY BAPTISED?

Many persons who want to join the Catholic Church have already been baptised in another Christian Church. They attend the sessions but do not need to be baptised again.

FIRST STEP - A PERIOD OF ENQUIRY

The RCIA process is a period of reflection, prayer, instruction, discernment and formation. Those who join the process are encouraged to proceed at their own pace, but, on average, the journey takes about 8 - 9 months of weekly sessions.

If the candidate wishes, this leads to the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism (if required), Confirmation and Eucharist at Easter with an ongoing attendance at Sunday Mass and observance of Catholic teachings and practices.

WHO ELSE IS INVOLVED?

Besides the RCIA Team, the entire community who participate in the Sunday Eucharist has a role to play through prayer and welcome.

RCIA IS FOR: Adults who are not baptised, Adults baptised in another Christian church and non-practising Catholics wishing to renew faith.

SESSION TIMES: 7:30pm - 9:00pm on a mutually agreed day of the week

Reflection

The gospel emphasises the two commandments which Jesus described as the greatest - love of God and love of neighbour. No matter how often we hear these words we are struck by the demands they put on us. Jesus brings together the love of God and love of our neighbour as something inseparable like two sides of a coin. Love of God is false if it is not complemented by the love of the people whom we encounter with everyday. Loving our neighbour as ourselves is a necessary element in giving our hearts and minds to God and that is where the challenge lies. It is wonderful in theory but difficult to put in practice. It can be challenging when the people next door are intrusive and others downright bad mannered, and perhaps with a workmate who is trying on our nerves. It demands great effort and yet more often than not, we meet God in such encounter. God cares about how we treat others. Everyone is made in his image and likeness. Let us have a good look of our lives. To profess that we

love God while remaining indifferent to the plight of others is a contradiction. We all want love to be a thornless rose, smooth to touch, but if we are following Christ we will find that it involves sacrifice and the shadow of the cross. Very few expect to find love in weakness, powerlessness and suffering and yet that is the heart of Christ's message to the world. This gospel is not an ideal to be admired, but a way of life to be lived.
