Advent is a four week season of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas and it always has a theme of looking towards the future coming of Christ at the end times. One of the prayers of the early Church which is linked with the season of waiting and longing, was the Aramaic word 'MARANATHA', which means 'Come Lord'. Use this prayer often this week as one way to begin preparation for Christmas.



Another way to bring Christ's coming into the family home is the custom of the Advent Wreath. The Advent Wreath is constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which are inserted four candles. According to tradition, three of the candles are violet, and the fourth is rose. However, four violet or white candles may also be used. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it is blessed by a parent.

The word 'Maranatha' could be used as part of the blessing.

The lighting of the candles may fittingly be included as a part of the evening meal. (Light two candles on the Advent wreath.)

This week we light the second of the Advent candles. We are reminded of the way John the Baptist called people to prepare the way for Jesus and we light these candles as a sign that we, too, are praying and preparing our hearts to welcome Jesus anew this Christmas.

2nd Sunday of Advent - Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

And so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repent-ance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

Pope Francis in *Evangelii Gaudium* (2013) noted that in the presence of God, during a recollected read-ing of the text it is good to practice *Lectio Divina* – the reading of God's word in prayer asking that it to 'enlighten and renew' us.

WEEKDAY MASS BOOKINGS:

Our week day masses will remain in the Chapel. Please note on Wednesday 9th December, Mass will be celebrated in the Chapel at **10:15**, Friday Mass will be at 9:30am. To book please call the parish M: 0434 224 483 on Tuesdays between 9am -2pm to book for both Wednesday & Friday Masses.

These Masses will continue to be celebrated under very strict guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

FIRST READING Isaiah 40.1-5, 9-11

Make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

- 1 Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.
- 2 Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins.
- 3 A voice cries out:

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

- 4 Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.



A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark.


- 1 The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

Reflection.

Advent is an invitation to conversion and John the Baptist gives us some down to earth advice on how to change our lives for the better. He talks about filling in valleys of prejudice, levelling down mountains of pride and straightening out the crooked paths of injustice. We ask ourselves what in our lives needs a complete turning around to allow God to come close to us. There are areas and dark corners of ourselves which we do not want disturbed. This advent time of prayer and penance brings home to us the need to make a fresh start. Welcoming God involves removing all blockages and obstacles which prevent him from coming close. Preparing a way for the Lord may mean walking a new path. Christ cannot save us without our cooperation. He does not force an entry into our lives but waits to be invited. The voice of John the Baptist reminds us that we have the important task of announcing Christ to others. Our everyday life is a



message telling everyone through acts of kindness, honesty and faithfulness that Christ is right here with us. His gospel of love is the answer to the problems of our troubled world. John the Baptist invites us to turn this advent season into a real spiritual homecoming by making the necessary preparations for the arrival of the Saviour into our lives. ~Fr. Arsenio
