



REFLECTION: 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." - Matthew 23:12

The world celebrates people in the spotlight and those who have the most of everything. We think celebrity, money and possessions is the key to happiness. Yet, our world is filled with more loneliness, anxiety and depression than ever before. The key to a happy life is relationship. Relationship with God and each other. Trust is the foundation of any good relationship and humility is the seed of trust.

FIRST READING

Malachi 1.14 - 2.2, 8-10

You have turned aside from the way; you have caused many to stumble by your instruction.

A reading from the book of the prophet Malachi.

- 14 "I am a great King," says the Lord of hosts, "and my name is reverenced among the nations.
- 1 "And now, O priests, this command is for you.
- 2 If you will not listen,

if you will not lay it to heart to give glory to my name," says the Lord of hosts,
"then I will send the curse on you and I will curse your blessings;
indeed I have already averaged there.

indeed I have already cursed them, because you do not lay it to heart.

- 8 "You have turned aside from the way; you have caused many to stumble by your instruction; you have corrupted the covenant of Levi," says the Lord of hosts,
- 9 "and so I make you despised and abased before all the people, inasmuch as you have not kept my ways but have shown partiality in your instruction."10 Have we not all one father?
- Has not one God created us?
 Why then are we faithless to one another, profaning the covenant of our ancestors?

GOSPEL

Matthew 23.1-12

The scribes and Pharisees do not practice what they teach.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

- 1 Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples,
- 2 "The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' chair;
- 3 therefore, do whatever they teach you and follow it; but do not do as they do, for they do not practice what they teach.
- 4 They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on the shoulders of others; but they themselves are unwilling to lift a finger to move them.
- 5 They do all their deeds to be seen by others;

for they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long.
