
"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." (Mark 9:35)

Migrant and Refugee Sunday - St Vincent de Paul Society Social Justice and Advocacy Asylum Seekers & Refugees Portfolio

On this year's Migrant and Refugee Sunday Pope Francis has chosen the theme: *Towards an ever wider "we"*. He refers to our world as "crumbling and cracking due to myopic and aggressive forms of nationalism" and that ". . . the highest price is being paid by those who most easily become viewed as *others*: foreigners, migrants, the marginalized, those living on the existential peripheries".

The Vincentian Refugee Network (VRN) has joined with *Catholics for Refugees* and a number of other Catholic agencies to support "150 days of Action for People Seeking Refuge", a campaign initiated by the Josephite Justice Network in Sydney. The campaign was launched in May and leads up to Migrant & Refugee Sunday on September 26. Its focus has been to call on the Government "to remove temporary protection visas and provide a permanent and safe resettlement pathway for all refugees and those who arrive here seeking protection." This campaign is especially relevant for refugees and asylum seekers, such as those from Afghanistan, who cannot settle and plan their lives, as their visa status presumes they will be 'sent back' when their country is no longer deemed dangerous for them. The 150 day campaign was to culminate in a 'Day of Lamentation and Call to Action' on Migrant and Refugee Sunday. While many plans for in-person vigils and gatherings have been cancelled, we are all invited to join together in a virtual 'Call to Lamentation and Commitment' on 26 September at 7 pm (via zoom). Focus on Afghanistan

We are all aware of the precarious situation in Afghanistan, especially for ethnic and religious minorities and women. In Australia, there are more than 5000 Afghans living on temporary protection or bridging visas, many with families still in Afghanistan and without any hope of reunion or certainty for their own future. The Vincentian Refugee Network, with other members of CAPSA (Catholic Alliance for People Seeking Asylum) is calling for an increased humanitarian intake from Afghanistan and guarantee of permanent residency to visa holders. Together with CAPSA the VRN is also assisting in the work of *Christians United for Afghanistan* and the Afghan Australian Advocacy Network to call on politicians to urgently review current policy, to increase the intake of people fleeing persecution in Afghanistan, and to provide permanent protection and enable family reunion for Afghan refugees currently in Australia on temporary visas.

REFLECTION

The disciples are an interesting bunch of people. When Jesus is telling them his coming passion and death, they are not even listening. They are so immersed in a quarrel over who is the greatest among them. Somehow we would really expect better from his followers. When asked by Jesus what were they arguing about, they were anything but proud of their discussion. They were in fact clearly embarrassed and remained silent. Jesus uses this occasion to point out to them what constitutes true greatness in God's eyes. He says that true greatness does not come from having power and influence over people but consists in humble service. He tells his ambitious disciples that everyone is important and that greatness comes from being available to all people.

This is a very basic instruction on the kind of followers Jesus wants us all to be and challenges us. Isn't it true that we are rather like the disciples arguing on the road about which of them was the greatest. Are we always putting ourselves first and wanting the best of everything? It is easy for us to think of what we have as completely ours with no thanks to anyone else. We fail to remember that we are stewards of the many precious gifts which God entrusts us and which he intends to be used in his service. Being available for the needs of others means being present in a hundred and one ways as people need to be listened to, understood and appreciated. We are called to do the Lord's work so that Jesus can give his love to others through us. Every life gives opportunities to serve those around. To be a disciple means being open to what God may ask of us at any given moment even in very small things.
