



Beyond the Desert

A study of the life of Moses, especially as it models the attitudes required for Christian leaders.

The course will take participants through the Schools of Pharaoh, of Midian and of the Desert, to learn specific spiritual and leadership lessons.

It discusses the qualities of his collaborators and the power of a leader's intercessory prayer.

REFLECTION: 5th Sunday of Easter

"The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone."1 PETER 2:7

Every person has been given gifts from the Holy Spirit. These are called "charisms" and they are used to build God's kingdom of earth. While many people are able to recognize their natural talents and abilities, they may be unsure of their charisms. If you know someone who is struggling for a direction in life, give them a little encouragement. Help them discern their charisms and how God is calling them to use them. Remember - no gift is too small or insignificant in God's salvation plan.

FIRST READING

Acts 8.5-8, 14-17

Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

A severe persecution began against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered.

- 5 Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed the Messiah to them.
- 6 The crowds with one accord listened eagerly

to what was said by Philip, hearing and seeing the signs that he did.

- 7 for unclean spirits, crying with loud shrieks, came out of many who were possessed; and many others who were paralysed or lame were cured.
- 8 So there was great joy in that city.
- 14 Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them.
- 15 The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit;
- 16 (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them;

if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil.

18 For Christ also suffered for sins once for all,

the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God.
