The Mary Candle

Today we honour Mary's role in our Salvation: She gave Jesus to the world.

Among our many Advent traditions is that of the Mary Candle

- A white candle tied with blue ribbon -

which stands witness to Mary's many months of expectancy and hope. In your home you might also light a Mary Candle as an added reminder of your hope in Jesus, the light of the world.

MARY'S PLACE IN OUR HERITAGE:

Pregnancy and birth are among the most common experiences of life - yet almost every pregnancy is extraordinary. We think of our Mothers who are expecting, and today too, of many Mothers who have lost their babies.

Like all mothers, Mary experienced the hope and expectation of her new child along with great physical and lifestyle changes. She was also on the threshold of a unique relationship with her God.

WHAT DOES MARY MEAN FOR US?

Firstly, Mary was human. She accepted God's call, but she still struggled with the meaning of much that she experienced.

It is clear that faithfulness does not mean an easy path, free of doubt and struggle.

Such example is relevant today in a world of many changes and challenges.

Secondly, it is also an appropriate time to acclaim the place of the feminine in our Church, as Mary exemplifies; the place of care and constant support, the willingness to remain faithful in times of trauma as well as times of joy. In a world that is thankfully growing in the recognition of the place of the feminine, we of the Church can look to Mary's response as a source of inspiration.



It is nearly Christmas! We light the four candles on the wreath, wrap presents, catch up with friends and family. And we remember that we do this in the name of Jesus, who comes to heal the world and inspires us to listen to God and live our lives in response to God's hopes for us.

4th Sunday of Advent - Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too:

your kinswoman Eliza-beth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son,

and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.'

'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

Reflect

If Mary became pregnant by the Holy Spirit—defined as charity, joy, peace, patience, goodness, longsuffering, fidelity, gentleness, and chastity—then obviously the child she gestated will radiate those qualities.

We awaken the Christ-child when we smile at charity, joy, peace, patience, goodness, longsuffering, fidelity, gentleness, and chastity until they begin to smile back. What comes back is the power of Christmas, a baby's power to transform a heart, divine power hidden in human weakness. We have to help make Christmas happen.

WEEKDAY MASS BOOKINGS:

We welcome Fr. John Dupuche in our parish as he continues to share to us his priestly ministry particularly in assisting the Christmas Masses. Rev. Dr. John R. Dupuche was born in 1940 in Melbourne to French parents who had come to Australia on business and who were prevented from returning to France by the outbreak of the World War II. He served for ten years as the coordinator of the Australian commission for Monastic Interreligious Dialogue. He is Honorary Fellow of the Centre for Interreligious Dialogue at the Australian Catholic University. He is coordinator of the School of Prayer within the Archbishop’s Office for Evangelisation, and a member of the Premier’s Multifaith Advisory Group. He has a doctorate in Sanskrit, specialising in Kashmir Shaivism and is particularly interested in its interface with Christianity. His book: *Abhinavagupta: the Kula Ritual as Elaborated in Chapter 29 of the Tantraloka* was published in 2003; *Jesus, the Mantra of God* in 2005; and *Vers un Tantra Chrétien* in 2009 (translated as *Towards a Christian Tantra*). He has written many articles in these fields. He lives in an interfaith ashram in Warburton area. He was parish priest of Nazareth Parish, Ricketts Point, Melbourne and appointed Pastor Emeritus on July 30, 2015.

The gospel of the Lord.



Reflection.

Mary is at the centre of this Sunday's gospel which gives us a simple but moving account of the greatest message that was ever delivered. In it we are told simply and plainly that there was a young maiden, who knelt down at the angel Gabriel's mysterious message and in the freedom of her heart, gave the total gift of herself to God saying 'be it done unto me according to thy Word.' Mary was needed by God so that he might carry out this plan for the world and send his Son among us. She was asked to cooperate with God and be the mother of Christ. The moment she said yes to the angel, salvation began and she brought that salvation to birth at Bethlehem on the first Christmas day. As she turned over in her mind what the angel's greeting could mean, she came only gradually to understand the message and mystery of Christmas. In listening to the word of God, Mary shows us an aspect of our Christian life which is of special importance. To be a Christian is to be a person who keeps their ears open to what God is calling them to do so that they can answer that call. We can ask her to help us have her attitude of listening and responding to God's call so that we can be as ready and as willing to bring Christ into our world as she was.
