We welcome the opening up of our places of worship and opportunities for gathering but remain mindful and respectful that many in our community remain feeling cautious. We also look forward to the time when all people can join together in various locations, and for the many activities that truly unite us fully as communities.

From 26 December, Weekend Masses will be celebrated on Saturday at 6pm and Sunday at 9am. <u>QR check will be required.</u> NO BOOKING REQUIRED

As Fr Arsenio will be taking some leave, Weekday Masses will not be celebrated during January.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to all masses to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be a welcomer on duty to assist.

Please arrive early to ensure you register and are seated well before Father is ready to commence Mass.

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- QR check in on arrival.
- Masks must be worn for those aged 8+.
- Sanitize your hands on arrival.
- Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

**REFLECTION** <u>Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph</u> "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are." (1

(1 JOHN 3:1)

A reading from the first book of Samuel.

Hannah, wife of Elkanah, had no children;

**11** she prayed to the Lord and made this vow:

"O Lord of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant,

and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child,

then I will set him before you as a nazirite until the day of his death.

He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head."

20 In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son.

She named him Samuel, for she said,

"I have asked him of the Lord."

21 Elkanah and all his household

went up to offer to the Lord the yearly sacrifice, and to pay his vow.

22 But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband,

"As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him,

that he may appear in the presence of the Lord, and remain there forever;

I will offer him as a nazirite for all time."

24 When she had weaned him, she took him up with her,

along with a three-year-old bull, a measure of flour, and a skin of wine.

She brought him to the house of the Lord at Shiloh;

and the child was young.

25 Then they slaughtered the bull, and they brought the child to Eli.

26 And she said,

"Oh, my lord! As you live, my lord,

I am the woman who was standing here in your presence,

praying to the Lord.

27 For this child I prayed;

and the Lord has granted me the petition that I made to him.

28 Therefore I have lent him to the Lord; as long as he lives, he is given to the Lord."

#### 1 John 3.1-2, 21-24 We are called children of God; and that is what we are.

A reading from the first letter of John.

 See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.
Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is.
Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God;
and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.
And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us.

24 All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them.

And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.
