Among the many events taking place in the life of the Church is the Synod on Synodality, a global and collective discernment on how the Church can become more "synodal" in character around three themes: Communion, Participation and Mission. As part of the local archdiocesan initiative, Catholics in Melbourne were invited to make submissions for consideration, an opportunity to express thoughts, ideas, and even discontents, about the current trajectory of the Church.

After the closing date, these submissions were collated and examined by a working group made up of three lay persons, a priest and an axillary bishop. The task of this working group was to identify prominent themes and synthesise the ideas into a report that could be handed to the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference, before being handed to Rome.

The online prayer service will engage these elements by gathering the Catholic community, telling stories through the medium of video, and praying together as sisters and brothers in Christ. The service will be recorded, and the video made available for further use.

#### Reflection.

When we come to worship, we usually make the sign of the cross. The words with the holy action 'In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, ' remind us that there are three persons in God. The feast of the Holy Trinity is a celebration of the mystery of God as a family of love. This reminds us of a simple truth which we often forget, God's plan is that we share in his life of glory. By our baptism we are raised to a level at which we become sharers in the family life of God. We are born of God the Father, God the Son becomes our brother, and the love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. This revelation of his inner life of three persons, in which we have a share, is one of God's greatest gifts to us and it is the model towards which all of us should aim and strive.

Everyday is a day to love so we should strive to make the Holy Trinity a more practical part of our lives. Love is the binding force, so when we love we share in that community of love which is the living God. It calls on us to respond to the love of God, poured into our hearts by Christ and the Holy Spirit, and invites us to look forward to the day when we shall share in the glory of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Volunteer Preferences for Days/Shifts in our Reduced 2022 Program

It is with very heavy hearts that, at this stage, we will NOT be able to offer our program 7 nights a week due to a shortage of volunteers - especially for Overnight shifts.

However the good news is we are aiming to provide 4 CONSECUTIVE nights a week of Winter Shelter in 2022 - Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Looking at volunteer preferences we feel confident we have covered Fridays and Saturdays e.g. Registered volunteers whose preference was ONLY Fridays at Holy Spirit or Saturdays at North Ringwood Uniting - will make up the core of the Friday and Saturday teams (but they will still need to complete the form https://forms.gle/3YtaDF2VXENe5osY9).

Using the data we already have from our Registered volunteers, we believe we can cover Thursdays at Croydon Hills Baptist Church and Sundays at Urban Life.

Next step is, we need ALL volunteers to

complete this form https://forms.gle/3YtaDF2VXENe5osY9 so we can update your preferences in line with the nights we are offering

Overnight shifts are always the most difficult to cover so if you could assist in that area that would be very much appreciated.

### **The Most Holy Trinity Sunday**

"But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth..." John 16:13

It has been said that the best gift we can give someone is to teach them how to pray. If you don't talk and more importantly, listen, to God every day, how else will you know what He is calling you to do? Just as you talk to family and friends every day, get in the habit of talking with God every day. Develop a daily prayer routine. Keep your prayers simple and sincere. This is best done in silence, when you can hear His response.

A reading from the book of Proverbs.

Thus says the wisdom of God:

- 22 "The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
- 23 Ages ago I was set up,
- at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
- 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.
- 25 "Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—
- 26 when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.
