Fourth Sunday of Advent

Advent is a four week season of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas and it always has a theme of looking towards the future coming of Christ at the end times.

This week we can bring the mystery of Christ's coming into our lives by using the Advent wreath and candle lighting ritual again.

In your prayer, give honour to Mary and Joseph for the way they cooperated with God's plan.

Highlight the significance of the name 'Emmanuel' that Jesus is truly "God with us"



Advent and Christmas are times of waiting, preparation and celebration. God is coming to us as Jesus; as the Messiah that was promised. Jesus is with us today, with His spirit in love. 'COME LORD, SON OF DAVID, SON OF GOD' Jesus was born of Mary, the betrothed of Joseph, a son of David. Matt 1:18-24

Try to be intuitive to God's voice this week. What is being communicated to you at this time in your life?

ADVENT GOSPELS

4th Sunday of Advent – Luke 1:39-45

39 In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country,

40 where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.

41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit

42 and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

43 And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?

44 For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy.

45 And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

REFLECTION: God's word is the focus in Luke's Gospel – God keeps His promises. Mary believed in the spoken word of God. The Word is among us.

We see God revealed in surprising ways – He came in the least of all clans, born into poverty and became a refugee. We need spiritual eyes to see God, graciously hidden in our midst.

THE MARY CANDLE

Today we honour Mary's role in our Salvation: She gave Jesus to the world. Among our many Advent traditions is that of the Mary Candle – A white candle tied with blue ribbon which stands witness to Mary's many months of expectancy and hope. In your home you might also light a Mary Candle as an added reminder of your hope in Jesus, the light of the world.

MARY'S PLACE IN OUR HERITAGE:

Pregnancy and birth are among the most common experiences of life - yet almost every pregnancy is extraordinary. We think of our Mothers who are expecting, and today too, of many Mothers who have lost their babies. Like all mothers, Mary experienced the hope and expectation of her new child along with great physical and lifestyle changes. She was also on the threshold of a unique relationship with her God.

WHAT DOES MARY MEAN FOR US?

Firstly, Mary was human. She accepted God's call, but she still struggled with the meaning of much that she experienced. It is clear that faithfulness does not mean an easy path, free of doubt and struggle. Such example is relevant today in a world of many changes and challenges. Secondly, it is also an appropriate time to acclaim the place of the feminine in our Church, as Mary exemplifies; the place of care and constant support, the willingness to remain faithful in times of trauma as well as times of joy. In a world that is thankfully growing in the recognition of the place of the feminine, we of the Church can look to Mary's response as a source of inspiration.

Christmas Masses will be celebrated at 5pm, 7:30pm & 10:30pm on Christmas Eve and 9am on Christmas Day.

PLEASE NOTE: with easing of restrictions allowing all parishioners to celebrate together, the planned 11am Mass for "Vaccination Status Unknown" has been cancelled.

From 26 December, Weekend Masses will be celebrated on Saturday at 6pm and Sunday at 9am. <u>QR check will be required.</u> NO BOOKING REQUIRED

As Fr Arsenio will be taking some leave, Weekday Masses will not be celebrated during January.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to all masses to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be a welcomer on duty to assist.

Please arrive early to ensure you register and are seated well before Father is ready to commence Mass.

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- QR check in on arrival.
- Masks must be carried.
- Sanitize your hands on arrival.
- Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

Dear People and Clergy of the Archdiocese,

Religious Discrimination Bill 2021

My prayerful greetings to you in the Lord.

I recently wrote to you about a bill before our State Parliament – the Equal Opportunity (Religious Exceptions) Amendment Bill 2021 – that sought to restrict the freedom of religious organisations in Victoria. Regrettably, the bill passed earlier this month after being rushed through our Parliament.

This unbalanced law imposed on people of faith, only adds to a steady decline of religious freedom in Victoria. It unfairly targets and undermines the ability of faith organisations to confidently manage employment matters according to their mission. On a national level, we have also had the introduction of the *Religious Discrimination Bill 2021* in our federal Parliament. While not perfect, I welcome the bill because it will provide basic human rights protections for Australians of all faiths to express their beliefs.

All Australian citizens, regardless of their religious belief or activity, should be able to participate fully in our society. They must be entitled to the equal and effective protection of the law and should not be discriminated against on the basis of their religious belief or activities in public life.

Significantly, given our situation in Victoria, the federal bill includes provisions to protect the ability of religious organisations to hire people who share their faith and values. Because what is being tabled is a modest and positive proposal for protection from religious discrimination, I hope both houses of Parliament will offer it safe passage without reduction. It is important that the federal bill attracts bipartisan support to ensure an enduring legacy for laws that help prevent discrimination against people because of their religious faith.

The bill has been referred to two federal Parliamentary committees, who will be consulting with organisations and individuals over the coming weeks. Conscious of the time of year, with the Christmas feast approaching, may I encourage you to do whatever you can to express your support of the federal *Religious Discrimination Bill* and also your concerns about the diminishment of religious freedom more locally in the State of Victoria – with our <u>federal representatives in Parliament</u>. Now, more than ever, there is a need to provide people of faith with protection under the law.

We are fortunate to live in a democratic society where we have the right and responsibility to advocate for fair and just laws. I encourage you to exercise this freedom. Information about how to take action on this issue is attached on page three.

I would also like to take the opportunity to express my prayerful unity with you this Christmas Season. It has been a challenging and difficult year, and I have been saddened that I have not had the opportunity to meet with you more, had normal circumstances allowed.

I pray that the peace of the Christ-child may renew you with his boundless love this Christmas and that the coming year be full of many blessings and a renewal of hope and faith.

REFLECTION <u>4th</u> Sunday of Advent

"For behold, when the voice of your greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leaped for joy." (LUKE 1:44)

When you hear the scripture readings and Gospel reading at Mass, do you "leap for joy?" If not, don't blame the lecturer or priest, rather look inside yourself. What are you doing to grow in friendship with Jesus? How do you prepare for Mass each week? Or, do you just show up and expect to be enter-tained? As the Body of Christ, we are called to be active participants, not just passive observers.
