**Dear Holy Spirit Parishioners** 

Regular Mass arrangements:

To comply with COVID regulations, anyone attending mass will need to use the QR code for electronic contact tracing purposes.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be welcomers on duty to assist.

Alternatively, you will have to write your details in a register.

Please arrive early to ensure you register and are seated well before Fr Arsenio is ready to commence Mass.

Weekend Masses are Saturday evening at 6pm, Sunday morning at 9am in the Church. We have resumed collections and Tea/Coffee after weekend Masses.

Please note: our maximum capacity in the church is 120.

Wednesday & Friday morning Masses will be celebrated at **9:15am** in the Chapel. Maximum capacity is 12.

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- You must carry a face mask at all times.
- Sanitize your hands on arrival.
- Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.

The chairs are not to be moved from the pre marked space.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

# Maroondah Winter Shelter – 2021

Throughout the lockdown period MWS has not been able to provide our usual shelter and meals for our local homeless community but we have not been idle. Homelessness and poverty still haunts Maroondah. The seven local churches of MWS has changed focus for this period to provide take away meals delivered to ac-

commodation houses and distributed from Café Vive in Croydon and Urban Café in Ringwood. Obviously compliance with Covid19 Restrictions have been implemented to protect both clients and volunteers. It must have worked because MWS distributed over 1325 meals, delivered 247 meals to housing, supporting 526 people ..... in the month of Aug 2020 alone.

Holy Spirit's involvement has been provided by Jacki Wooten and her team of cooks. Our deepest appreciation goes to Jacki and those other generous people.

With the new year comes a new look.

Holy Spirit will be teaming with Uniting Church North Ringwood (Dickson Cres) to provide meals from the café's on Sunday evenings once a month. We will need 85 meals so that means cooks and volunteers to facilitate the distribution. Jacki will again be coordinating the program. Our first Sunday is on Feb 28.

### How can you help?

If you can cook we can use your service. The more cooks we have then the fewer times each will be called upon. If you are good with people we need volunteers to manage the distribution.

If you would like to donate, we would prefer Supermarket Vouchers that can be given out to clients (esp. families).

We aren't taking general groceries but we can use Long Life Milk, Bottled Water, Breakfast Cereals and Tinned Soups. These can be left at the School Admin during the week or at the Church (at mass times). To donate cash, please go to the Maroondah Winter Shelter webpage and donate online.



# Week 6: History of Project Compassion

Over half a century, generations of Australians have partici pated in Project Compassion. It has raised more than

\$500 million since it began in 1965 – making it one of the nation's longest running charity campaigns.

For many, Project Compassion's iconic collection boxes have become a nostalgic part of their lives – a reminder around home, school, church and the community that it's time to support Caritas Australia's annual appeal Margaret Moriarty can't remember a time without a Project Compassion box in her house during Lent.

"Donating to poorer counties was very important to my mother and father. My children have grown up with the same iconic boxes in our home and my grandchildren are continuing the tradition," Margaret says. Throughout five decades of natural disasters, conflicts and crises, Caritas Australia has worked alongside vulnerable communities, with the generous support of Australians.

Project Compassion has also helped with access to education, health services and agricultural training, and through programs that reduce maternal and infant mortality.

During COVID-19, local partnerships have helped Caritas Australia to respond quickly to minimise the spread of the coronavirus. As we are still under strict Covid guidelines and our numbers are restricted, we have reintroduced the TryBooking system for Holy Week & Easter. NB: there is no charge, but you still have to click on Puchase before continuing the booking process Bookings are now open. Should there be "walk ups" at any of the services and no seats are available inside the church, there will be the option of sitting/standing outside on the asphalt (at 1.5 meter distancing!)

For the celebration of Holy Week, the Archdiocese has suggested that media coverage of the celebrations presided over by the Bishop be facilitated, encouraging the faithful who are unable to attend their own church, to follow the diocesan celebrations as a sign of unity. # GOSPEL

### Mark 15:1-39

1 As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation

with the elders and scribes and the whole council.

They bound Jesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate.

2 Pilate asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

He answered him, "You say so."

- 3 Then the chief priests accused him of many things.
- 4 Pilate asked him again, "Have you no answer?

See how many charges they bring against you."

- 5 But Jesus made no further reply, so that Pilate was amazed.
- 6 Now at the festival he used to release a prisoner for them, anyone for whom they asked.
- 7 Now a man called Barabbas was in prison with the rebels who had committed murder during the insurrection.
- 8 So the crowd came and began to ask Pilate to do for them according to his custom.
- 9 Then he answered them, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?"
- 10 For he realized that it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed him over.
- **11** But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas for them instead.
- 12 Pilate spoke to them again,
- "Then what do you wish me to do with the man you call the King of the Jews?"
- 13 They shouted back, "Crucify him!"

14 Pilate asked them,

"Why, what evil has he done?"

But they shouted all the more, "Crucify him!"

15 So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for them;

and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified.

**16** Then the soldiers led him into the courtyard of the palace

(that is, the governor's headquarters); and they called together the whole cohort.

17 And they clothed him in a purple cloak;

and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on him.

18 And they began saluting him, "Hail, King of the Jews!"

19 They struck his head with a reed, spat upon him, and knelt down in homage to him.

20 After mocking him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.

21 They compelled a passer-by, who was coming in from the country,

to carry his cross; it was Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus.

22 Then they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull).

23 And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh; but he did not take it.

24 And they crucified him, and divided his clothes among them,

casting lots to decide what each should take.

**25** It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him.

26 The inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews."

27 And with him they crucified two bandits, one on his right and one on his left.

29 Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying,

"Aha! You would destroy the temple and build it in three days;

30 save yourself, and come down from the cross!"

31 In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes,

were also mocking him among themselves and saying,

"He saved others; he cannot save himself.

32 Let the Messiah, the King of Israel, come down from the cross now, so that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also taunted him.

33 When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon.

34 At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?"

which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

35 When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "Listen, he is calling for Elijah."

36 And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying,

"Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down."

37 Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.

**38** And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.

39 Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last,

he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

40 There were also women looking on from a distance; among them were Mary Magdalene,

and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome.

41 These used to follow him and provided for him when he was in Galilee;

and there were many other women who had come up with him to Jerusalem.

42 When evening had come, and since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the sabbath,

43 Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus.

44 Then Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and summoning the centurion,

he asked him whether he had been dead for some time.

45 When he learned from the centurion that Jesus was dead, he granted the body to Joseph.

46 Then Joseph bought a linen cloth, and taking down the body, wrapped it in the linen cloth,

and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock.

He then rolled a stone against the door of the tomb.

47 Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where the body was laid.
