Dear Parishioners,

As we emerge from lockdown, we are pleased to be able to join together to celebrate Mass again. Weekend Masses will be celebrated on Saturday at 6pm and Sunday at 9am for fully vaccinated parishioners, with a maximum of 20 in attendance at each Mass. QR check in and proof of vaccination will be required. Bookings for the weekend Masses will be via TryBooking www.trybooking.com/BUXTP

Weekday Masses (unknown vaccination Status) will be celebrated in the Chapel on Wednesday and Friday mornings at 9:15, with a maximum of 10 people allowed. QR checkin will be required. To book please call Jacinta on 0434224483

Sunday Mass for those with unknown vaccination status is under consideration with a view to commencement in November.

As the "Roadmap out of Lockdown" is updated, these arrangements will be reviewed according to directions from the Victorian Government and the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be COVID Marshals on duty to assist.

Please arrive early to ensure you register and are seated well before Fr Arsenio is ready to commence Mass.

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- **You must wear a face mask at all times.**
- **Sanitize your hands on arrival.**
- **Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.**

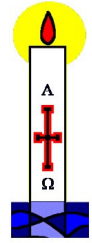

BECOMING A CATHOLIC – RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)



Have you been feeling a nudge in your heart to deepen your relationship with God?
Are you searching for meaning in your life?
Do you feel restless, without direction?
Are you looking to join a Faith Community?
Do you want to know more about the Catholic Faith?
Are you a Catholic who has not been confirmed or received first communion?
If you answered "YES" to any of these questions, RCIA may be the answer you are seeking.

THE RCIA PROCESS

RCIA is the normal way in which adults become full, active, participating members of the Catholic Church. The goal of the process is "full communion" which means "full active participation" in the Eucharist and in the whole life of the Catholic faith community. RCIA helps adults to grow in their relationship with God, become familiar with Catholic teachings, get acquainted with people in the community and involved in service within the community.

ALREADY BAPTISED?

Many persons who want to join the Catholic Church have already been baptised in another Christian Church. They attend the sessions but do not need to be baptised again.

FIRST STEP - A PERIOD OF ENQUIRY

The RCIA process is a period of reflection, prayer, instruction, discernment and formation. Those who join the process are encouraged to proceed at their own pace, but, on average, the journey takes about 8 - 9 months of weekly sessions.

If the candidate wishes, this leads to the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism (if required), Confirmation and Eucharist at Easter with an ongoing attendance at Sunday Mass and observance of Catholic teachings and practices.

WHO ELSE IS INVOLVED?

Besides the RCIA Team, the entire community who participate in the Sunday Eucharist has a role to play through prayer and welcome.

RCIA IS FOR: Adults who are not baptised, Adults baptised in another Christian church and non-practising Catholics wishing to renew faith.

The RCIA process utilises the Symbolon program – a DVD based, structured program exploring the many facets of the Catholic faith – more information regarding this program can be accessed via the website à [Symbolon: The Catholic Faith Explained - FORMED](#)

The XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops
For a synodal Church:
communion, participation, and mission

My dear friends,

It would seem during this time of 'lockdown' and physical isolation, that the impulse to seek ways of hearing each other's voices, of listening deeply and of finding life-giving pathways together, have resonated deeply within each of us. Here in Melbourne, we have begun the journey towards personal and parish renewal; Australia-wide we have only just finished the first Session of the National Plenary Council; and this week we launch, in its local context, the Diocesan Phase of the Synod of Bishops. (The ACBC website has some helpful timelines to note: <https://www.catholic.org.au/synodalchurch/>).

Whilst this might seem to be a case of challenging diary management, particularly during this time of uncertainty, there is no 'chance' occurrence of the interweaving between our Take the Way of the Gospel, the Council, and the Synod. At the local, national, and universal levels – the Holy Spirit's compelling call to all the people of God, the Body of Christ in the world, towards paths of profound renewal are reverberating loudly through every facet of our lives.

With this letter I launch and invite you as faithful of Melbourne into the synodal journey for the universal Church that was commenced with the official opening of the XVI Ordinary General Synod of Bishops on 10 October. It is now our opportunity to begin engagement in this important two-year convocation that seeks to hear and consider how we are walking together as a synodal Church in our announcing of the Gospel? And what steps the Spirit invites us to take in order to grow in our "walking together"?

To do this, the Church is seeking to draw in the participation of the greatest number of people in order to listen deeply and attentively to the living voice of the entire People of God. The purpose of this first phase is consultation at our local level, and the Proclaim Team will be co-ordinating how we can capture the richness and wealth of our experiences of lived synodality across our Church here in Melbourne. You will be hearing more in the coming weeks, please take some time to read more in preparation: <https://www.synod.va/en.html>

I strongly encourage your participation, and there will be varying mechanisms for individual and group submissions. Beautifully, the preparatory document has also encouraged us not to merely think of producing mere documentation of activity – but offer a dialogue, as the Holy Father reminds us, "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, yearn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands." (Pope Francis 2018)

In the opening ceremony last week, Bro Alois, the Superior of the Taizé community, was invited to share some thoughts:

"This synodal process comes at a crucial moment when we can see two contradictory developments. On the one hand, humanity is becoming more clearly aware that we are all linked to each other and to the whole of creation. On the other hand, polarisation is growing in the social, political, and ethical domains, causing new divisions in societies, between countries, and even within families. Unfortunately, between our churches and also within them, there is a trend for differences to become polarisations that separate people, at a time when our witness to peace is vital...How can we move Christian unity forward?"

This certainly is what we have been asking of ourselves locally, nationally, and now globally. It is not a 'dragging of feet' against the tide – but a joyful embracing of the Holy Spirit's call as to what is possible. Again, there is no 'chance,' we only need to open our ears and hearts.

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the prayer *Adsumus, Sancte Spiritus*, "We stand before You, Holy Spirit." This same prayer was invoked during the first Session of the Plenary Council, and I share it with you now...

*We stand before You, Holy Spirit,
as we gather together in Your name.
With You alone to guide us,
make Yourself at home in our hearts;
Teach us the way we must go
and how we are to pursue it.
We are weak and sinful;
do not let us promote disorder.
Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path
nor partiality influence our actions.
Let us find in You our unity
so that we may journey together to eternal life
and not stray from the way of truth
and what is right.
All this we ask of You,
who are at work in every place and time,
in the communion of the Father and the Son,
forever and ever. Amen.*
