Second Sunday of Advent

Advent is a four week season of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas and it always has a theme of looking towards the future coming of Christ at the end times.

This week, find ways to be 'good news' to others,
especially those who are sick, alienated or marginalized.

2nd Sunday of Advent - Luke 3:1-6

- 3:1 In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene.
- during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.
- 3 He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins,
- 4 as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.
- 5 Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth;
- 6 and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

REFLECTION: Luke writing about John the Baptist's ministry places the events in the context of time and history. This is first century Palestine. God's message is proclaimed in a world where many voices clamour to be heard.

Whose voice are we listening to?

God is making the rough places into a plain, but we are called to prepare the way.

There is a harvest of righteousness when God brings his word to completion. This gives us hope.

We never complete our mission in life – "We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers not master builders…" Bishop Oscar Romero.

Dear Parishioners,

As we emerge from lockdown, we are pleased to be able to join together to celebrate Mass again. Weekend Masses will be celebrated on Saturday at 6pm and Sunday at 9am for fully vaccinated parishioners. **QR check in and proof of vaccination will be required. NO BOOKING REQUIRED**

Sunday Mass for those with unknown vaccination status will be celebrated at 5pm each Sunday.

Maximum capacity is 50. NO BOOKING REQUIRED

Weekday Mass celebrated Wednesday & Friday mornings at 9:15am in the Chapel.

THE WEDNESDAY 9:15 MASS WILL BE FOR FULLY VACCINATED ONLY.
FRIDAY MORNING MASS WIL CONTINUE TO BE A "VACCINATION STATUS UNKNOWN" MASS.
You will still need to book for both days by ringing the Parish Office. 70369395

The chapel will remain open on Wednesday and Friday mornings after Mass has been celebrated for Private Worship.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to all masses to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be COVID Marshals on duty to assist.

Please arrive early to ensure you register and are seated well before Fr Arsenio is ready to commence Mass.

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- You must show proof of vaccination at "Fully Vaccinated" Masses
- Masks must be carried.
- Sanitize your hands on arrival.
- Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

- At a minimum, speak during Lent about the annual Caritas' Project Compassion campaign using provided materials.
- If able to, connect with schools in the parish to encourage them to register for on-line Caritas Conversations and use the Caritas Justice Resources.

- Connect you to our International program staff through on-line events, so you can engage with the Project Compassion stories personally.

REFLECTION 2nd Sunday of Advent

"And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value..." (PHILIPPIANS 1:9-10)

During the Christmas shopping season it is easy to get caught up in the frenzy of buying gifts. But, is that "gift" truly an expression of your love for the other person. Or, are you just fulfilling your "obligation" to give them something? To grow in friendship with someone, you need to spend time with them, learn what is of value to them. Maybe this year, buy less "stuff" and spend more time with those you love.

A reading from the book of the prophet Baruch.

- 1 Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on forever the beauty of the glory from God.
- 2 Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting;
- 3 for God will show your splendour everywhere under heaven.
- 4 For God will give you evermore the name,
- "Righteous Peace, Godly Glory."


