Second Sunday of Advent

Advent is a four week season of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas and it always has a theme of looking towards the future coming of Christ at the end times.

In what ways are you preparing a way for the Lord to come into your life?



The Advent Wreath is constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which are inserted four candles. According to tradition, three of the candles are violet, and the fourth is rose. However, four violet or white candles may also be used.

The candles represent the four weeks of Advent.

The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it is blessed by a parent. The word 'Maranatha' could be used as part of the blessing.

Use the Advent Wreath as a focus for prayer. Pray for all those who need to hear the word of God in their lives. In today's gospel, we are invited to:

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'

Perhaps you could pray these words as you light the candles on the Advent Wreath as part of the evening meal.

Volunteers Needed

Winter Shelter Community Meals Program is an ongoing program which is offered throughout the year. It began in 2020 when Covid stopped us providing the "usual" Winter Shelter overnight accommodation program. We began to provide "take away" meals to those in lockdown whether in homes, motels or those without accommodation. After Covid restrictions were lifted the take away meals program has been expanded to a sit down 3 course meal to those in the community who are needing support because of financial or social disadvantage.

These meals are provided twice a week, Wednesdays from St John the Divine in Croydon and Fridays from Urban Life in Ringwood.

Our volunteers support the program in an area they feel comfortable

- off site cooking in teams (or individually) to provide the meals
- driving collecting and delivering meals to venues
- available during the week to collect or deliver donations, etc
- at a venue setting up/cleaning up
- in the kitchen
- serving meals
- organising tea, coffee, etc
- interacting and chatting with the guests

We need volunteers who can help from 4.30pm-6.30pm.

On that day:

- 1 A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
- 2 The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
- 3 His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear;

- 4 but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

GOSPEL

Matthew 3.1-12

Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

- 1 In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming,
- 2 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."
- 3 This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,
- "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:
- 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."
- 4 Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey.
- 5 Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan,
- 6 and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.
- 7 But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, John said to them,
- "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?
- 8 "Bear fruit worthy of repentance.
- 9 Do not presume to say to yourselves,
- 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.
- 10 Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.
- 11 "I baptize you with water for repentance,

but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me;

I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

12 His winnowing fork is in his hand,

and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
