Trinity Sunday

The early Christians struggled to understand the belief that God is both one and three. Many great councils of the Church were held to clarify what this meant and to find the language with which to describe the trinitarian relationship between Father, Son and Spirit.

It was not until the Council of Constantinople in ad 381 that the doctrine of the Trinity was defined. Many of the prayers of the Church express our belief in a triune God (three persons in one). One of the greatest and most simple of these prayers is the sign of the cross, in which we dedicate ourselves 'in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit'.

St Augustine described the Trinity in terms of the Lover, the Beloved and the Love that exists between them.

"God -

the glorious Transcendent;
the powerful, illuminating and transforming Holy Spirit;
the divine knowing and intelligent
Wisdom of the Creator and Logos,
each revelation being the fullness of God"
