

'The Blessing' Project

Hi everyone! To help keep our Parish community going during the COVID lockdown, we are starting another **choir-inspired** music video project. This time, we would like to involve as many people from the Parish as possible, especially families and children.

You may have seen a song called 'The Blessing' that has been sung throughout the world in a multitude of languages by Christians during COVID-19 to remind the world that God is with us and to give everyone a sense of belonging and unity. You can find some great versions on YouTube – just search for The Blessing. We would like to do a Holy Spirit Parish version of The Blessing. All you have to do is record a video of you or your family singing, playing, dancing or just waving along in time with the music. You can submit more than one video, and if you are a musician, we'd love to have you playing as well. A video with as many familiar faces as possible would be most uplifting to our community so please don't feel that you need to have musical talent to be involved. If you have a real aversion to singing feel free to just clap along to the song, tap a triangle, saucepan lid, sway, dance, hold up a sign of love, peace etc. This is about sharing something as a community. If you would like to be a part of this project please follow the instructions below.

How to record your video

You'll need a mobile phone with a camera, and someone to operate it (or use a stand if you have one). You can use the selfie camera if you like, but the rear camera will generally produce best results. If you aren't able to record a video, a photo of your family doing something would be fine.

You will need to sing/play/dance in time with the backing track. You can find the backing track on YouTube at this link https://youtu.be/yWHQ9YRmXBg.

If you are singing or playing an instrument, it would be good if you can listen to the backing track on earphones so it doesn't come out in your recording. For musicians, there is an attached lead sheet if you need it. The lyrics are also attached.

Once you have recorded your video, please contact Bill or Maree Buttler to arrange for it to be picked up. We can use a USB drive to transfer it, or you can upload it to YouTube and send us the link, or email your photo to us at billnmaree@optusnet.com.au (videos will probably be too big to email).

Once we have enough contributions, we'll put them together into a video collage that can be displayed on the Parish website and Facebook page. Get recording, and have fun!

It is with great heartbreak that we learnt of the explosion in Beirut which killed over 100 people and wounded thousands. Lebanon has suffered multiple waves of conflict and disaster. A drawn-out civil war, followed by years of conflict with her neighbours, has been compounded by the strain on resources caused by the Syrian war and an influx of refugees. Tuesday's explosion came at a time when the country is already gripped by an economic crisis and reeling from the impacts of COVID-19. The situation is dire. Yet the Caritas network is on the ground, doing what it can to alleviate suffering by delivering emergency food and medical resources at a time of intense crisis.

Caritas Australia has committed to provide immediate response in the form of crucial financial support as part of its already established Middle East Regional Appeal. Additionally, through its in-country staff and partners in Lebanon, the wider Caritas network is working to deliver:

- Food and water.
- Hygiene kits including masks and soap.
- Material for shelter repairs and the clean-up of debris.

Medication and other health services.

Currently Caritas Australia supports two programs in Lebanon, including a Protection program supporting shelters for women and children who are survivors of gender-based violence, and a Humanitarian program supporting Syrian refugees and vulnerable Lebanese host communities. As the heading says we have moved our web site. We are no longer at www.cam... Instead you can find us at: www.holvspiritparish.org.au.


There have been some useful changes which are best explained by reading these notes in conjunction with the image of our home page (next page).

- The web site can now be searched. This is perhaps the best of the improvements. If you're looking for something and can't remember where it's placed start here.
- If you are on a small form factor device (smart phone or table) you will see the "hamburger" in the top left corner. Click this to see the menu
 (3)

The Menu

- a. The menu now sports "Covid 19". This is the full list of announcements we have made since the restrictions took place – mostly these come from Jacinta's weekly update. We also have the most recent two on the home page ("Covid 19 Updates" refer 6). Previously we had the most recent one on the home page and the rest on another page that was a bit less obvious to find and much harder to maintain. This change is mostly of benefit to me;)
- b. "News, Events" has been revamped. It used to be a menu list of articles which were difficult to navigate and appreciate what they might contain. Now it is a series of summaries each with an associated image and details should you wish to "clickin". This means a more manageable interface and better user experience.
- c. Contact Us can is now fits on our menu. Previously it was only available by the phone icon in the top right corner which is not the first place many people would look.
- The rotating banners are as they were a number of standard (e.g. current Mass season which clicks through to mass times) and newly

- featured items (e.g. click through the Choir image to see and hear our Choir in action) each of which allows the user to click-through to the content.
- "Holy Spirit Parish Online How we stay connected" is as it was – a place to click through to see a list of online resources such as weekly streamed masses and Zoom meeting updates, etc.
- Covid 19 Updates. As explained in 3a, this is the most recent two announcements and you can "click here for more updates on Covid 19".
- Welcome to Holy Spirit Parish. This too is unchanged and our Welcome message to the world.
- Reflections. This is as it was, a reflection from our Parish Priest. However, a significant recent change is that a new reflection is added reliably each week. It doesn't matter how sophisticated the web site is if it has no interesting content. Now we have something valuable to share regularly. Thanks Father Arsenio! (Click "More Reflections..." to previous ones).
- Tweets by @Pontifex is Pope Francis' Twitter Feed. This is as it was. It automatically updates daily. I have no interest in Twitter myself, but I feel that this feed is worthy of our time.
- At Today's Readings you can find today's Bible readings courtesy of Melbourne Catholic (Catholic Archdiocese Melbourne).
- 11. The 8 Icons at the bottom of every page are technically the same. They are a quick way to navigate to main sections of the site. With the change I have taken the opportunity to give "Spirit Extra!" its own button (Helen can lay claim to this new small piece of "screen real estate" next to her "Spirit Magazine").
- The Footer is unchanged. It too shows at the bottom of every page and tells people who and where we are and also has links to the legal type documents that is required of us.

started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus.


30 But when he noticed the strong wind,

Reflection.

When confronted with stress and pressure of various kinds, we are very much like Peter. A sudden turn of events in life and we are faced with storms which threaten the peace and security of our homes and families. We need to hear those encouraging words of Christ, 'Don't be afraid.' Peter's mistake was that he turned to Jesus in real prayer only in a moment of crisis when he was paralysed by fear and in danger of drowning. We are reminded particularly those who tend to forget about God when all is going well and who only become serious about prayer when problems and tragedies surface. The words "all we can do now is pray" become an attitude which regards prayer as a last resort when all else fails. Christ is prepared to help us at all times and not just in our hour of desperation. If we turn to him in all the circumstances of our lives, he will show us how different his presence makes everything. When Peter accepted the Lord's invitation to come to him across the waters, he was taking a risk. It was a leap in the dark and a journey into the unknown. Likewise, we have been invited by Christ to leave our relative security and follow him with conviction and courage through the storms and trials of this life.
