Dear Holy Spirit Parishioners

Regular Mass arrangements:

To comply with COVID regulations, anyone attending mass will need to use the QR code for electronic contact tracing purposes.

You will need to bring your mobile phone to use the QR code system. If you do not have a phone, or your phone does not work with the QR system, there will be welcomers on duty to assist.

Alternatively, you will have to write your details in a register.

Please arrive early to ensure you register and are seated well before Fr Arsenio is ready to commence Mass.

Weekend Masses are Saturday evening at 6pm, Sunday morning at 9am in the Church. We have resumed collections and Tea/Coffee after weekend Masses.

Please note: our maximum capacity in the church is 120.

Wednesday & Friday morning Masses will be celebrated at **9:15am** in the Chapel. Maximum capacity is 12.

All Masses will continue to be celebrated under guidelines, which have been approved by Archbishop Comensoli.

Under no circumstances should anyone awaiting test verification, including Clergy (even without presenting symptoms) attend a church or parish setting until a diagnosis is confirmed. Additionally, under no circumstances should anyone attend who is closely connected to people who are awaiting test results or who have tested positive.

The restrictions are as follows:

- **You must carry a face mask at all times.**
- **Sanitize your hands on arrival.**
- **Sanitise your hands as you approach Father for communion.**

The chairs are not to be moved from the pre marked space.

Communion during covid-19 at this time may only be taken by hand.

REFLECTION: 4th Sunday of Easter

Jesus speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd. The image of the shepherd as the one who shepherds the flock, the people of Israel, is one of the themes of the Old Testament. In the gospel Jesus says that he is the good shepherd. Hired hands might do a good job when things are going well, they will look after the sheep and take them to fresh pastures, but they do not own the sheep, and so will run away when life becomes difficult.

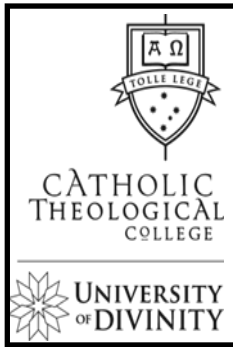

Winter Shelter 2021 - The Holy Spirit Community will again be hosting the Winter Shelter program this year from June 1 to Sept 15. The program will operate in the same manner as in 2019 but within a Covid19 Safe plan that is being developed. The program provides meals and overnight shelter for up to 12 homeless men who have been selected by Wesley Mission - Ringwood, Homelessness & Support Services as being low risk. The seven church groups involved take a night of the week each. Holy Spirit again has Friday nights. The program operates within strict policies and experience has shown that these are effective. The program commences at 5:30pm and all guests must leave by 8am Saturday morning. The men are restricted to the Church hall and turning circle outside the hall and will be brought in and out by bus. If anyone has any concerns please feel free to email me at

The program has had endorsement from Fr Arsenio, the Parish Pastoral Council, School Administration and the School Board as well as the Vicar General but even more significantly, from the people of our community. Many of the volunteers from previous years have already volunteered again but there is still a need for more. Please check out the flyer below for information about the program and how to volunteer.
