


The Fete Committee is made up of current and past school parents and members of the wider Holy Spirit Parish community.

# **REFLECTION: Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**

"As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" Matthew 10:7

Many of us take our lives for granted. We think we have plenty of time to "repent." Maybe we should live with a little more urgency in making things right with God. This is the difference in living our discipleship out of obligation versus out of love. Obligation implies we do the minimum required. Love implies we want a relationship. God wants us to be with Him in Heaven forever, but He also wants to be in relationship with us right now, while we are on earth. Start this second – invite the Lord into your heart.

# **FIRST READING**

#### **Exodus 19.1-6a**

You shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation.

A reading from the book of Exodus.

- 1 On the third month after the Israelites had gone out of the land of Egypt they came to the wilderness of Sinai.
- 2 They had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped there in front of the mountain.
- 3 Then Moses went up to God; the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying,
- "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the Israelites:
- 4 'You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself.
- 5 Now therefore, if you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples. Indeed, the whole earth is mine,
- 6 but you shall be for me a priestly kingdom and a holy nation."

Romans 5.6-11

If we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely will we be saved by his life.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

- 6 While we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.
- 7 Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person.

Though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die.

- 8 But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.
- 9 Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God.
- 10 For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life.
- 11 But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

### Matthew 9.36 - 10.8

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and sent them out to proclaim the good news.

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

- 36 When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.
- 37 Then he said to his disciples,
- "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few;
- 38 therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest."
- 1 Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness.
- 2 These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John;
- 3 Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus;

- 8 Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons.
