"Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise."" Luke 10:37

This was Jesus' command at the end of the Good Samaritan story. Did you know that the Samaritans and Jews despised each other? The moral of the story is to love our neighbor. That means loving someone you may not know, or someone that looks different than you, or someone that has different beliefs than you, or someone that you don't like. All without expecting anything in return

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

Moses spoke to the people, saying, 10 "Obey the Lord your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law; turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul. 11 "Surely this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. 12 It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' 13 "Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' 14 "No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe."

# GOSPEL

Luke 10.25-37 Who is my neighbour?

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke.

25 A lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" 26 Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" 27 The lawyer answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself." 28 And Jesus said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." 29 But wanting to justify himself, the lawyer asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?" 30 Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. 31 Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. 32 So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33 "But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. 34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. 35 "The next day the Samaritan took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." 36 Jesus asked, "Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" 37 The lawyer said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."
